# Fox News Reports on Wide Open Border

# CHURCH COLUMNS

Walk into any Roman Catholic Church that is 30 years old or older, and one is immediately aware of the beautiful columns. We are also aware that modern structural technology permits us to span much greater distances than those used in most churches. Why then, do we use so many columns, and why are they spaced so close together? We'll find the answer after being told that buildings that have been erected during any period in history or in any location in the world have been affected by certain influences. Generally speaking, these are influences of climate, available materials, and religion.

In tropical climates, the interior spaces of buildings are kept cool by using small windows, low-pitched roofs, and boldly projecting eaves. In northern climates, the roofs are quite steep in order to shed snow loads. Where granite, the hardest of all natural building materials, is readily available, the buildings are severe and simple in their treatment in contrast to ornate structures in countries where the stone (marble) is soft and easily worked. In countries that are thickly wooded, such as Norway and Sweden, timber is often used. And where stone and timber are difficult to obtain, brick buildings are predominate.

Considering the religious influence, we find that the

Egyptian belief in life after death caused the construction of those incredible pyramids, while mythology did the same for the Greeks and their beautiful temples. The magnificent colonnades and fountains set before many Catholic churches had their beginnings in the atrium and the wells or wash fountains of the Early Christian era, while the mosaic work done in substitution or sculptured figures is the chief characteristic of Byzantine churches.

The Egyptian temple was a rectangular-shaped structure. The entrance was centered on one end, between two huge masses of masonry that we call pylons. These temples were sanctuaries containing some rooms for the general public and other rooms, which only kings and priests were permitted to enter. They were quite different from later Christian churches, as they were not used for common prayer or public ritual, but for mysterious rites and priestly processions, which took place within their guarded

Applying our theory of influences, we find that the desire for permanence and the annual flooding of the Nile resulted in available stone being the selected building material for Egyptian temples. It was used for floors, walls and roofs. It is most important to understand that when used for roof construction the stone slab is limited to relatively short spans. Consequently, the creation of any kind of useable interior space could only be realized by employing many stone columns, closely spaced. During later eras, the Greeks took the architecture of the Egyptians and improved it almost to perfection. The Greek architecture, in turn, influenced much of the Roman construction. And because the Early Christians were essentially Romans, we find this influence of closely spaced stone columns reflected in most of the subsequent Christian church architecture.

The motion was presented by Hon. Fucsia Fitzgerald Nissoli and Hon. Federico Mollicone, who are distinguished members of the Italian Parliament's Chamber of Deputies.

Discussions on the motion began in October 2020, and its' passage represents a landmark victory for Italians and Italian Americans alike.

The motion's stated purpose is outlined below:

"The Italian Chamber of Deputies commits the Government

1) To take action, on the political and diplomatic level, so that the Italian cultural heritage in the USA and the symbolic figure of that heritage embodied by Christopher Columbus may be safeguarded;

2) To use all the communication tools available to the Government, to grant the enhancement, both at the level of bilateral Italy-U.S. relations and at the multilateral level, of the real historical role of Christopher Columbus, an explorer moved by the noble sentiments of discovery, at the basis of the evolution of society and of the whole of humanity."

The Conference of Presidents of Major Italian American Organizations (COPOMIAO), led by Basil M. Russo, fully endorses this first-ever motion by the Italian Parliament, which, up until now, was unengaged on the fight for Columbus in the U.S.

COPOMIAO, the national voice on Italian American issues, would like to extend its unwayering gratitude to Hon. Nissoli and Hon. Mollicone, and to Umberto Mucci — the Founder and CEO of **We the Italians**.

With virtually no support from their peers to begin with, these Italian leaders spent years defending Columbus as a symbol of Italian American history and pride, and without them this near-unanimous vote would not have come to fruition.

In July, Mucci will organize a press conference live from the press room of the Italian

"Italian Americans are proud that our brothers and sisters in Italy appreciate the significance that Christopher Columbus represents in the history and assimilation of Italian immigrants and their descendants into American society. We are very grateful for their support," said Basil M. Russo, in response to the newly passed motion.

The time-honored Columbus Day celebrations were launched in the late 1800s as Italian immigrants attempted to create a sense of self-esteem and dignity during a period where they were subjected to lynchings, bigotry and prejudice throughout the U.S.

Columbus's journey sparked 500 years of immigration to America, attracting peoples from throughout the world seeking a better life for their families — this is the spirit we champion and are fighting to preserve, and this is what the Columbus statues stand for.

# Our Stance:

The Italian American community has always supported the designation of an Indigenous Peoples Day as it is most rightly and most justly deserved.

However, it's patently unjust that our heritage be erased to appease another group.

With today's motion, the governmental and business leaders in Italy have sent a clear message that the unfair and lawless treatment of Italian American history will not be tolerated.

Summer Fruit for Sweltering Days

Ah, summer — the time of vivid sunshine, warm breezes, and days spent relaxing at the beach. It is also the time when I crave fresh fruit the most. The early summer crop of June boasts some of the juiciest, most succulent fruit around. What constitutes summer if not a big bite out of a fireengine red watermelon, its pulp disintegrating into a sweet and refreshing drink? What else can brighten June mornings like a pile of gem-hued strawberries artfully scattered over cereal or pancakes? What about the clinking of ice cubes floating in a glass of peach or cherry juice - doesn't the mere thought of such a drink bring relief on a stiflingly humid day? Yes, summer fruits have always appealed to me, which is why I was both delighted and surprised to find that they contain a wealth of folklore and superstitions woven between their stems and vines. So let us embark on a journey of taste and the sort of lore that has been handed down from our ancestors, originating from the days when agriculture formed the backbone of almost every society

1) Cherries: I love to bake with cherries. Their tartness perfectly accentuates sweet cakes and muffins. On Memorial Day, I even made a fruit crisp with a blend of peaches and cherries, and it was simply sublime. If people loved cherries so much that they wanted to guarantee a good crop of them, a Swiss superstition states that the first cherry of a tree must be eaten by a woman who recently gave birth to her first child — hopefully, the woman's fertility would rub off on the tree and ensure a plethora of fruit for the next harvest. Meanwhile, Italian author Andrea Malossini asserts that it is lucky to find a twin cherry, or two cherries sharing a single stem. Another Italian proverb states "Giugno ciliege a pugno," meaning that June has an abundance of cherries!

The Algonquin tribes knew June's full moon as such because it coincided with the time that strawberries were ripe for gathering. A quaint legend states that if a person breaks a double strawberry (two strawberries that somehow grew together in one) in half and shared it with another person, the two would be destined to fall in love. There is still some debate about how strawberries got their name. One version states that the little yellow seeds resembled flecks of straw, while another popular theory declares that the shoots of the plant would often be dispersed around the ground, leading the fruit to develop a name that derives from the Anglo-Saxon word for "strewn." In Italy, strawberries are known as fragole and grow wild. They are enjoyed drizzled over panna cotta or marinated in balsamic

It was once believed that eating a peach would impart wisdom. They are also thought to bring longevity and keep evil spirits at bay - not bad for a fruit found readily in supermarkets everywhere! In China, the country to which the fruit is native, peaches are closely associated with immortality and divinity. This is because the blossoms of the peach tree appear before the leaves do, an unusual occur-

will often adorn doorways and gates with peach wood to drive away malevolent forces and attract good luck. In Italy, peach, or pesca, is a popular and pastries.

are the quintessential summertime fruit for us in the United States, emblems of relaxation and hot weather. However, among the Romani people of the Balkans, watermelons have a far stranger connotation - vampires! According to folklore, a watermelon left alone at night on the full moon has the potential to turn into a vampire, rolling around and scaring townspeople. The full moon also features in an Italian superstition about melons. Andrea Malossini writes that melons will grow fatter and fuller if planted under the full moon in March. Perhaps the hope is that they will grow to resemble the moon! For me, summer always meant my father bringing home and breaking open a fresh cantaloupe from an Italian market, revealing the sunny orange hue within. How I love these summer meloni!

So there you go, a sweet bevy of fruit folklore and superstition. Hopefully this adds more curiosity and wonder to your enjoyment of Earth's bounty during the summer months. Enjoy a season of fresh fruit and healthy eating — but please, keep an eye on any melons left out overnight!


# Four Women "Quattro Donne" subtitle, A North End Love Story

With Monty Python's Spamalot

The Ogunquit Playhouse

Returns Us to the Bright Side of Life - Now through July 10<sup>th</sup>

In the early spring of 2020 hope began to fade that the corona Virus was going to recede and the reality that life for all of us was going to be quite different for some time was setting in. At the time Brad Kenney, Executive Artistic Director of the Playhouse, had to make the announcement the 2020 Season would be canceled. Brad did this via video and the poor guy could not have looked more beaten down. His heart and soul is in the Ogunquit Playhouse and having to let the public know the curtain wouldn't be going up last year was heart wrenching. It seemed sure the place would remain dark for a long time. Some wondered if it would be able to survive.

Well, Brad may have been staggered and even floored, but the count never got to ten. He soon recovered and was back in the fight, a fight he was not going to lose. After having to refund over 50% of the ticket sale money for the up coming season Brad went to work on fundraising, and more importantly, keeping the flame burning at the playhouse. This began with video talks with Playhouse Alumni such as Sally Struthers. The mood was changing for the better. Next was the Playhouse Cabaret Series where performers from past seasons displayed their talents before small crowds outside the theatre in a cafe setting. So, even though the season was officially canceled, there were still performances taking place before a live audience.

As the 2021 Season approached it was still unknown if the COVID restrictions would allow for the theatre to reopen. Since it takes some time to put together full scale productions it was decided to build a pavilion next to the theatre where it would be easier to allow for social distancing and ventilation.

With generous donations from the many loyal supporters of the Playhouse, and a huge gift from benefactors Carol and Noel Leary, the Leary Pavillon was erected and a four show season was planned.

Last Friday night the season kicked off with Monty Python's *Spamalot.* As one of the tag-lines from Monty Python goes; "And now for something completely

different." Well, not completely different as this production lives up to the high standards the Ogunquit Playhouse has always adhered to.

It was an interesting choice as the first musical to play since the pandemic hit in that it opens with references to plague and deaths. Grim? Not at all, gallows humor is exactly what is needed at this time. The laughter that came from the audience in response to those lines shows the resilience people have and how, just like the Ogunquit Playhouse, we are not giving up.

Charles Shaughnessy is excellent in leading the cast as Arthur the King who just can't seem to command respect. Sent by God on a quest to find the Holy Grail, Arthur is accompanied by his faithful companion Patsy (Jen Cody). Along the way the King assembles members of his Knights of the Round Table, a motley crew who often take things Arthur says literally which causes more than a little Pythonish confusion.

Dennis Galahad (Daniel A. Lopez) is not easily convinced to become a knight as he has the radical idea leaders should be chosen by the people and not by Divine Right. The Lady of the Lake (Mariand Torres) appears and wins over Dennis with Come With Me who now becomes Sir Galahad. Ms Torres while singing hilarious songs shows her talent as a genuine Broadway Belter with the Diva's Lament and Find Your Grail/The Song That Goes Like This.

Jen Cody is outstanding as Patsy. Her performance of the show's best known song *Always* Look On The Bright Side Of Life was pitch perfect, and she showed great comedic expressions when Mr. Shaughnessy sang I'm Alone. Poor Patsy who

had stood by the King throughout thick and thin was a riot as she looked to the audience with "What about me looks?" as Arthur spun his tale of loneliness.

With many of the devices that make Monty Python so popular, such as a giant wooden rabbit, the huge hand, poking fun at the French, and riding on horseback sans horses, fans won't be disappointed.

The big show tunes are a treat as well. You Won't Succeed On Broadway (Josh Grisetti) is Mel Brooksian in its formula for it's humorous take in what you need to produce a Broadway Show while His Name Is Lancelot (Nic Rouleau) is best described as Lancelot's coming out song.

By the finale the audience was fully back in theatre mode. Music, laughter, beautiful sets, and the joy of the Ogunquit Playhouse is back. Life is good again.

I'd like to say a few things about the Leary Pavilion. While it is different from the main theatre it is a very interesting setting for a play. It accommodates 75% of the Playhouse's indoor capacity. The 25,000 square foot steel structured, fully covered, open air performance venue has a 96 foot wide stage, a full array of lighting, and much better acoustics than I expected. A major plus is having the seats arranged in "pods" of two for social distancing. This also ensures every audience member is guaranteed an aisle seat with plenty of leg room. For a fidgeter like me this is a positive delight. Site lines are clear and unobstructed. You don't have to crane your neck to look past people's heads. Is the pavilion better than the indoor theatre? No. Is it worse? No. It is a different and very interesting experience, and it works very, very well.

Brad Kenney deserves more than high praise for making this all happen. Don't think twice about buying tickets for Spamalot and the rest of the season. Come out of your cocoon and step into the world of outstanding musical theatre at the Ogunquit Playhouse. It really feels good to be back looking at the bright side of life!



# Saint Romuald of Ravenna

Romuald was born in Ravenna, in northeastern Italy, to the aristocratic Onset family. His father was Sergius degli Onesti and his mother was Traversara Traversari. As a youth, Romuald indulged in the pleasures of the world common to a tenth-century nobleman. At the age of twenty he served as second to his father, who killed a relative in a duel over property. Romuald was devastated, and went to the Basilica of Sant'Apollinare in Classe to do 40 days of penance.

After a time of reflection, Romuald became a monk.

San Apollinare monastery had recently been reformed by St. Mayeul of Cluny Abbey, but still was not strict enough in its observance to satisfy Romuald. His harsh correction of the less zealous monks aroused such anger against him that he applied for, and was readily granted; permission to transfer to Venice, where he placed himself under the direction of a hermit named Marinus and lived a life of extraordinary severity.

Romuald spent the next 30 years going about Italy, founding monasteries and hermitages. He attempted to go to Hungary but was prevented by illness. In 1001, however, the Holy Roman Emperor Otto III founded a monastery at Pereum, near Ravenna, for Romuald and St. Bruno of Querfurt. The monastery served as a mission for the Slavs and Prussians. The most significant monastery founded by Romuald and Bruno was Camaldoli, 1012, near Arezzo in Tuscany. It became the motherhouse of the new order, which combined cenobitic and eremitical elements with strict silence. By adding a note of severity to the Benedictine rule and by choosing the life of a hermit, Romuald initiated and helped to mold a movement that was to give birth to the Carthusians and the early Cistercians.

Romuald passed away on June 19, 1027. The Feast Day of Saint Romuald of Ravenna is June  $19^{\rm th}$ .

# Nanna & Babbononno

moving out of East Boston in the spring of 1961. When Dad house to save money. Actually, and Mom were married in the mid 1930s, Dad was on the road with the big bands of the swing era. I know he played bass with Vaughn Monroe, Count Basie and several other name bands of the day. Actually, he had grown out of East Boston. When he and Mom were married, he agreed to stay local as Mom was devoted to her parents.

After I was born, they moved from Brainerd Road (Musicians' Row) in Allston to 70 Eutaw Street, the home Babbononno had purchased back in 1920, the home Mom and my uncles grew up in. Uncle Paul, Aunt and Ellie lived in an apartment Babbononno had put together on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor. Nanna, Babbononno, Mom, Dad and I lived in the rest of the house.

During WWII, Nanna had a heart attack and was hospitalized for quite some time. When and his only salvation was his she finally came home, her house was too much to handle any longer. Uncle Paul moved his family to St. Edwards Road in Orient Heights and Dad rented a 3<sup>rd</sup> floor apartment two doors away at 74 Eutaw Street. Babbononno sold the house he my grandfather: no where to buy had purchased 20 something years earlier and rented an apartment on Princeton Street, a ten minute walk away.

We lived in the third floor walk-up until the spring of 1961, approximately 20 years later. Dad had wanted to move to the suburbs right after the war ended, but Mom was dedicated to helping her folks almost every day and wouldn't hear of ever leaving. That episode I wrote about last week concerning the stolen parking space was the last straw for Dad. He put a down near Maverick Square and we payment on One Broad Street in moved Babbononno back to his Belmont, and we moved there on Good Friday in 1961.

I was in my first year teaching in the Boston schools, and because I was paying my way

Last week, I was talking about through a master's degree, decided to move in to the new I was teaching at Boston Tech, working a couple of nights a week at the Seville Theater and playing music on weekend nights and whenever I could book something, so I was semiindependent. Giving up an intown apartment that I shared with two friends allowed me to afford to live with my folks and pay my way through my next degree.

The neighborhood in Belmont was a Yankee neighborhood. Most of the residents were descendents of the people who had settled Boston back in the day and we were the outsid-Eleanor and my cousins Paula ers, interlopers, gate crashers. Eventually, the neighbors warmed up to my folks and accepted them, but Babbononno felt out of place. He was widowed in 1958, as Nanna had passed away just before Christmas that year. It was three years later, store front social clubs, and his cronies who met in the oval shaped park in Central Square, puffed on their stogies, read Il Progresso or this newspaper and discussed the politics of the day. Belmont was not the place for stogies, nowhere to buy Italian newspapers and no one to hang around with to play Italian card games or discuss the politics of the day.

> Considering my grandfather's emotional state, Mom, Dad and Mom's brothers made the decision to find an apartment back in East Boston just for Babbononno. A year or so had gone by living in Belmont and everyone in the family could see how unhappy my grandfather was. They found an apartment environs, which made him a lot happier than he had been in quite a while.

> I finished my first master's degree in the spring of 1964, and concentrated on music more than ever. I had become quite proficient as a bass player and experienced every- thing from symphony to soul. When I did have time to myself, I headed back to East Boston (just like Babbononno did). My closest friends still lived there, and in the warm weather, I would meet them at the handball court located at Shay's Beach (Constitution Beach) in Orient Heights.

> Babbononno developed a routine that was on a daily basis. After breakfast, he would head from Maverick Square to Central Square where a couple of his storefront social clubs existed. He played cards, read his newspapers, sipped espresso and socialized with his Italian cronies. He was once again a happy

> Mom and Dad made lots of new friends in the Belmont neighborhood as time went on. Cocktail parties were quite common and they were always invited even if my folks didn't drink. Dad always kept a well stocked bar for the guys in the neighborhood when they visited and they were all pleased with that. At back yard barbecues, Mom often added in some Italian delicacies to entice the Yankee

neighbors who were more into a good martini than a good pizza. I used to kiddingly say that with their Yankee taste buds, boiled white bread was a spicy delicacy.

A lady friend of mine had given me her puppy when she discovered that she couldn't take care of it. With my schedule, I was never home and Dad became the proud father of Tammy a terrier pooch. When Babbononno was over the house, being a dog lover himself, he tried to play with the dog, but he couldn't get his tongue around the name, Tammy. It came out as "Sammy," and the dog would look at my grandfather with her head bent to one side, but they both survived.

Those were happy years for my folks living a different life style than what they had known in East Boston. The only two negatives were the passing of Grandpa Christoforo and Babbononno in the '70s.

During the '60s and '70s, Sal Meli, my old friend from East Boston and I had the opportunity to travel. He worked at Polaroid and was able to work his vacation time around

My Boston teaching schedule and we traveled the world. Both of us had come close to saying, "I do," a couple of times but nothing worked out for us with our lady friends and we were fancy free to do whatever. As Mom and Dad got older, they were able to take a few cruises and travel. Neither ever wanted to visit Italy. I think it was the stories about the hardships their folks had to endure before they came to America, but those are stories for another day.

As the tomatoes begin to ripen and eggplants come into season, summer is the perfect time to make a delicious Eggplant Parmigiana or Parmigiana di Melanzane. As with most Italian



dishes, much debate surrounds the origin of this southern Italian specialty. Many thought the name parmigiana derived from parmigiano cheese, however, parmigiano is not native to the southern regions of Italy where this dish is most often found. The Parmigiana di Melanzane is extremely popular in the Calabria regions; however, it is the Sicilians that claim to be its original creators. They explain "parmesan" has nothing to do with cheese. In fact, it was derived from "palmiciana" which in Sicilian dialect means "shutters" and refers to the slatted panes that the layered eggplant slices in this dish resemble!

My Nonna, being from Sicily would most likely agree that Parmigiana di Melanzane was definitely of Sicilian origin. She made many amazing dishes with eggplant, and Eggplant Parmigiana was one of my favorites. As a little girl, I distinctly remember my Bisnonna Annunciata slicing, salting, layering, and then placing a heavy cordless iron on the eggplant to what she claimed would "drain out all of the bitterness" before cooking them! Every family has their own special way of making a Parmigiana di Melanzane. This is the way my family taught me, and though it's a process, the end result is absolutely scrumptious. I hope you enjoy my "Nonna's Eggplant Parmigiana" as much as my family and I always did!

# NONNA'S EGGPLANT PARMIGIANA La Parmigiana di Melanzane Della Nonna

4 medium long eggplant (the fatter, the more seeds) Sea salt

6 to 8 large eggs, beaten

4 to 6 cups fresh breadcrumbs seasoned with parmesan cheese

6 cups tomato or marinara sauce (I make a simple tomato and basil sauce)

10 to 12 leaves fresh basil, torn into small pieces 2 to 4 cups olive oil

1 to 2 pounds shredded mozzarella cheese

Salt and freshly coarse ground black pepper to taste

# Prepare Eggplant:

Wash, dry and slice eggplant into ½ inch slices. Layer the eggplant in a single layer, salt, and place weight over to drain all the bitter juices out. Let sit for 30 minutes, wipe off salt and excess liquid with paper towel, set aside.

# Dip, Bread and Fry Eggplant:

In a medium bowl, add beaten eggs. In a large flat dish, place breadcrumbs. Layer a baking sheet with parchment or wax paper. Take slices of eggplant and dip in egg then place in breadcrumbs making sure to bread both sides. Place on lined baking sheet before frying. Once all eggplant is dipped and breaded, pour about 1 ½ to 2 inches of oil in a large frying pan. Warm over medium heat and fry eggplant until lightly golden, turn and repeat on the other side. When cooked, place eggplant on paper towels to drain. Layering and Baking:

Preheat oven to  $350^{\circ}$ . Take a  $13 \times 9$  baking dish and layer the bottom with a thin layer of tomato sauce; add a layer of eggplant, tomato sauce, cheese, and basil. Repeat layering in this manner until you have 3 layers of eggplant topped with tomato sauce, cheese and basil. Cover with aluminum foil and bake for about 40 minutes, or until cheese is melted and eggplant is thoroughly cooked. Let sit for at least 30 minutes before cutting and serving.


# **EXTRA** Innings



The two would not fight again until after WWII in a fight that was anti climatic. This time Louis won easily by a kayo in the  $8^{\rm th}$  round.

Their first meeting was the last really big fight before America entered the war. A lot changed




Conn on the attack in the First Fight




Louis vs. Conn I

It takes quite a number of people to enable a franchise to run smoothly. Most fans see a number of them when they enter an arena. There are the players and coaches, of course. In addition, fans may interact with ushers, food vendors and those staffing the souvenir shop.

But then there are the people never seen by the public at large. They are just as necessary, perhaps in some instances even more so than those who are the center of attention on an everyday basis.

One such example was Nicole Hynes of Brookline, who, along with husband Paul and their three children, provided a home setting for a number of Boston Bruins rookies over the years.

Although it is not dwelled upon very much, a number of the players who have come to Boston over the decades have been teenagers, usually just out of junior hockey in Canada. They are even younger than other players who chose to play in college, even if they did not stay the entire four years.

And thus it was that one Joe Thornton was selected as the number one overall pick by the Bruins in the 1997 NHL Draft — an event that was held just a couple of weeks before he turned 18 on July 2 that year. To those attuned to the world of hockey, he was Jumbo Joe — a center with an impressive 6-4 presence on the ice who had posted 76 points in his first season in the Ontario Hockey League followed by a whopping 122 in his second.

Even before training camp commenced, he had a 50,000-watt media bulb shining on him with headlines in all the local print edition newspapers of the era proclaiming him the potential "savior" of the franchise, one that had not won a Stanley Cup since 1972.

But to Nicole Hynes, who died recently at age 77, he was a teenager from St. Thomas, Ontario (population around 38,000) arriving in a metropolitan area that over two million people call home. And a home is what Nicole and her family provided at their Brookline residence.

From a comfy room to home-cooked meals to just the daily banter about the rhythm and pulse of family life, there was something reassuring to those so far from their hometowns.

Thornton was not the first to experience the warmth of the Hynes family. Earlier there had been Stephane Quintal from Montreal, a defenseman fresh from the Quebec Major Junior Hockey League who was drafted 14<sup>th</sup> overall in the 1987 draft by the B's. Robert Cimetta from Toronto, a left wing who was another first round pick of the Bruins (also 14<sup>th</sup> overall) in the 1988 draft, also stayed with the Hynes family during his rookie season.

Those were the three that were mentioned by name in Nicole's obituary that ran in the *Boston Globe*. "Nicole was a surrogate mother to so many," it stated. "She loved them like her own children. Nicole took care of many more who lived with the Hynes family over the years, all remaining incredibly close."

We send our sincere condolences to her husband Tom and to their now adult children, Vanessa, Clare and Thomas, for providing such a warm and caring family atmosphere to those Bruins rookies of former times. Truly a place where every day was Mother's Day.

DOC IS A GREAT COACH EXCEPT ... right at the end, when the string has run down to a decisive game seven. It is at that juncture that Doc Rivers, the head coach of the 2008 NBA Champion Boston Celtics, as well as the 2010 team that came within six and a half minutes of winning another title, has a record of faltering at the finish if the series goes to an ultimate deciding contest.

Doc, who has coached in 15 series that eventually extended to a game seven, has lost nine of those decisive contests, the most in NBA history, according to the website Basketball Forever. To make matters worse, he has lost five of those nine game sevens at home (also an NBA record), meaning that his team was the better seed in each of those series. The most recent example of that situation came on June 20 when Doc's Philadelphia 76ers team was upset by the Atlanta Hawks.

The site also points out that Rivers has 29 losses in potential close-out contests (which may come earlier than game seven), the most in the history of the league. The site added that his .341 winning percentage in those close-out games, when compared to other coaches who have coached in 20 or more such contests, puts him at the bottom of the group.

But one does have to remember that to get to a deciding seventh and deciding game, a team had to win three games to force such a climatic contest. Not necessarily an easy thing to accomplish by

Everyone agrees that Doc is a great coach despite the fact that his teams have struggled a bit during the playoffs in recent times, having not advanced past the second round since 2012.

However, one can't deny that how a team performs in the playoffs is, in the end, the definitive standard by which all else is measured in pro sports. So it is up to Doc to see that his team has a long playoff run. If that does not occur, then Doc will be on the move again, signing with another franchise in the 30-team league that will surely hitch its hopes to the potential of success that his presence still brings.

HOCKEY EAST CHANGES PLAYOFF FORMAT — Although teams are still competing in the 2021 Stanley Cup Playoffs, Hockey East has already jumped to the college conference's 2022 tournament by announcing a change in its playoff format.

All 11 teams will participate in the new single-elimination format that will begin on March 9 and will culminate in the league's traditional semifinal games (March 18) and championship contest (March 19) at the TD Garden.

"This new format gives all of our student athletes the chance to compete for a championship, which is undoubtedly the most important part of the season," noted Hockey East Commissioner Steve Metcalf, who enters his second season at the helm of the conference. "This will highlight the importance of every game for players and fans alike," noted the commissioner.
