Air Force Cited in Texas Mass Shooting

A federal judge last week ruled that the USAF is "60 (percent) responsible" for the 2017 mass shooting at a Texas church because it failed to report the gunman's violent criminal history. Devin Patrick Kelley killed 25 people when he opened fire at the First Baptist Church in Sutherland Springs during a Sunday morning service. Kelley died apparently from a self-inflicted gunshot wound while fleeing.

I remember this shooting well since I was visiting family down in Texas when this tragedy happened. The small community where the shooting took place was about 80 miles south of Austin and it was big news on local TV and across the nation. I can remember how nervous folks were after this shooting and remember learning that many small churches actually had armed Congregationalists protecting service goers.

In his ruling, the judge found that if the Air Force submitted information about Kelley's convictions to an FBI database, which could have prevented him from buying weapons from licensed dealers, more likely than not, would have deterred him from carrying out the Church shootings. The decision was in response to a series of lawsuits brought against the federal government by survivors of the shooting and relatives of the victims.



THE RENAISSANCE



Doges Palace, Venice, Italy

During past issues, we examined briefly the history of the Roman Empire as well as the Early Christian, Romanesque, and Byzantine periods, which followed. We also discussed the great Gothic era and the development of its beautiful stained glass. We now focus upon the Renaissance, the last of the great historical periods in Europe.

Dictionaries define renaissance as a rebirth or a revival. The Renaissance in Europe is defined as a revival or a period of renewed interest in the art and literature, which had flourished during the earlier Roman and Greek (classical) cultures. We are told that this renewed interest started during the time of the Crusades. We remember

the Crusades as the series of military expeditions undertaken by the Christians for the purpose of liberating the Holy Land from the Muslims. The only practical way for these crusading armies to get from Europe to the Holy Land was to travel on foot to the seaports of Greece or Italy, and then cross the Mediterranean by boat. During the land portion of these expeditions, the Crusaders became exposed to the remnants of the ancient Greek and Roman civilizations, and this renewed interest is one of the major factors that caused the birth of the historical period, which we now refer to as the Renaissance.

This Renaissance period is said to have begun in the fifteenth century when Filippo Brunelleschi submitted the winning design for a Renaissance dome on the Gothic cathedral of Florence, Italy. Most of the other construction which followed throughout Europe continued to reflect the Renaissance influence. These later structures are St. Paul's Cathedral in London, the Doge's Palace in Venice, the Victor Emanuele Monument, Saint Peter's Basilica in Rome, the National Capital in Washington, D.C., and most of the older U.S. government buildings, the Boston Public Library, the Copley Plaza Hotel in Boston, and most of the older public libraries and city halls in the U.S., to name a few.

Saint Peter's Basilica is said to be the most important building in the Italian Renaissance period, and this edifice will be the subject of next week's issue

It Ain't Necessarily So

"The problem with quotes on the internet is that you can never be sure they're authentic." — Abraham Lincoln

As I write this column, I am thinking of my friends on social media, most of whom, in the frenzy of the current political media circus, seem to have lost all common sense. My Facebook feed if full of false memes, fake quotations devised to support this or that political view. My friends, both Republican and Democrat, appear to have temporarily lost the ability to distinguish news from parody and truth from phony "quotes."

"A free people ought not only be armed and disciplined, but they should have sufficient arms and ammunition to maintain a status of independence from any who might attempt to abuse them, which would include their own government." — George Washington

FAKE. There is no record that Washington ever said that. If you have read any of Washington's writings you know that in an age when "flowery" prose was in style, he was flowery even for his age. Had Washington ever expressed the sentiments above (which I somewhat doubt in view of his role in suppressing the Whiskey Rebellion), he would likely have done so in at least three times as many words. Often I've wanted to quote Washington in my columns, but I find it very difficult due to his prolix prose. A good rule of thumb is that any Washington "quote" brief enough to fit in a Facebook meme, is likely not a real Washington quote. The website: http://www.mountvernon.org/ has a list of this and other spurious Washington quotes.

"If I were to run, I'd run as a Republican. They're the dumbest group of voters in the country. They believe anything on Fox News. I could lie and they'd still eat it up. I bet my numbers would be terrific." — Donald Trump, in *People* magazine, 1998

FAKE. There is no record that Trump said that in *People* or anywhere else. One tipoff is that while Fox News existed in 1998, it had been around for just over a year and wasn't even available in all parts of the country, it was hardly, in 1998, the massive voter influencer that the meme suggests.

"The end of democracy and the defeat of the American Revolution will occur when government falls into the hands of lending institutions and moneyed incorporations." — Thomas Jefferson

FAKE. While the quote is perfectly in tune with Jefferson's distrust of banks and of commerce, he did not say it, at least not in those words. The tipoff is "moneyed incorporations." While Jefferson would have known of what we now call not-for-profit corporations, such as colleges, churches, and municipalities, for profit business corporations, with few exceptions, did not exist until a quarter of a century or so after Jefferson's death. Italy earned \$40.4 million in prize money from EUFA's tournament record fund.



Birthday Bashes Through the Years



My birthday is quickly approaching on Tuesday, July 20th, and it has gotten me thinking about these unique celebrations in general. Birthdays fall under the category of rites of passage, or milestones, and, as a result, cultures around the world celebrate birthdays with special customs and traditions. While we think of birthdays as great opportunities for parties and food, in ancient times people viewed birthdays as dangerous occasions because of their liminality, being poised between one year and the next. As such, birthday parties included — and continue to include — loud noise and noise makers to scare off the evil spirit believed to be lurking around during this period. Many vestiges of these ancient fetes remain. From birthday cakes to picking up the check, here are special birthday traditions from around the world.

Our first stop, of course, is Italy, one of the original homes of the birthday cake. Though scholars are still unsure about the roots of the birthday cake, many theorize that these sweet treats originated in the Mediterranean world. Ancient Greeks baked round cakes to honor Artemis, the goddess of the moon and the hunt, and then illuminated the cakes with candles in order to better resemble the moon. The ancient Romans, on the other hand, made sweet honey cakes to serve at birthdays and weddings — where they were traditionally broken over the bride's head for good luck! However, the custom of placing candles on a birthday cake comes from Germany, where a large candle was often situated in the center of the cake to symbolize life. Modern Italian birthday traditions resemble those of America. People gather for a birthday cake, food, a party and gifts. There are some differences, however. Beware of people pulling on your earlobes if you celebrate your birthday in Italy — they will pull the corresponding number of years you are turning. Also, if a group of friends go out to dinner, it is the friend celebrating the birthday who is expected to pay for the meal. Finally, since saints are an important part of Italian society, children are often named for the saint whose day coincides with their birthday. Or they may celebrate on a smaller scale during the day belonging to the saint who shares their name. My father, for example, was born on August 16th, which is Saint Roch's day, and so my grandmother appropriately named him Rocco!

Foods are an important part of birthday celebrations around the world. Australian children can expect to be served the charmingly named Fairy Bread, or buttered bread covered with multicolored sprinkles, during their parties. Children in Brazil receive marzipan candies shaped like fruit. Candies feature in Mexican birthdays as well, where they are concealed in a piñata which is later broken open by blindfolded guests. The Dutch, on the other hand, like to feast on pancakes sprinkled with powdered sugar. Many birthday foods also reflect the theme of good luck for the upcoming year. A person celebrating their birthday in China will eat long noodles,



which symbolize a long life. Russians have birthday pies instead of birthday cakes, and a message bestowing good fortune upon the birthday person is inscribed on the crust. Finally, Canadian children can expect a more immediate form of luck at birthday parties. Whoever finds a coin hidden in his or her slice of birthday cake will have the first turn in all of the feast's games! In addition to food, sometimes the specific age a person is turning forms the focal point of birthday celebrations. Usually these special birthdays honor the entrance into adulthood. The United States has "sweet sixteen" celebrations, while Latin American countries hold elaborate quinceañeras when a girl turns fifteen. These parties' rival weddings and the girl shares a special dance with her father. In the Jewish tradition, bar or bat mitzvah rituals near a teenager's thirteenth birthday welcome the boy or girl as adult members of the community.

Birthdays are a special time to honor both human joy and resilience. They indicate that we have once again made it through a year filled with myriad human emotions, from happiness to disillusionment, challenges and triumphs. They remind us that we have the strength to endure. Like holidays, birthdays are an indication that the year cycles on, and that is a good reason to celebrate. Whether we celebrate with cakes or dinners, when we honor a birthday, we honor the passage of time, but also all that is timeless — love and family and good food. That is the true meaning of the candles winking and blinking cheerfully on a birthday cake, a symbol that, like us, has come a long way.

Horror in Winthrop — Where Else Could Be Next?

As a retired police sergeant with 28 years on the job, I have seen America improve over my lifetime, but I also seem to be getting less and less shocked by acts of unexplainable violence, which many times have racial components attached to it.

What happened on Saturday, June 26th should have never happened in Winthrop or any other community. America in general, and Boston in particular, has had a complicated history when it comes to race.

However, while many residential neighborhoods around us still exhibit high levels of segregation, there are other parts of the City of Boston, which have grown leaps and bounds and hardly resemble the Boston of 1974 when racial tensions spilled over into the streets over a Federal Court order that divided up kids in neighborhoods. The Federal Judge in this case even stated his job wasn't to improve the equality and quality of what was being taught in the school system nearly 50 years ago, his job was demographics of who sat next to who in the classroom.

As a result, instead of folks holding our elected officials accountable, folks turned on each other. Boston residents of all shades and colors saw each other as the enemy when the real architects of racial unrest were never held accountable.

As someone who grew up in lower Roxbury/South End in the '50s and '60s, we seemed not so divided from each other. Most of us came from working-class families struggling along with our parents who were trying to raise families and making the futures of their children better than theirs.

As a child of that era, I had all kinds of friends and their color was secondary. The bind that held us together wasn't race, but geography. I believe the problem with violence today

is that too many in society, in government, and especially in the news media have been very successful with the politics of division. I certainly believe that what just happened in Winthrop where victims were most likely selected by skin color or what just happened with that Rabbi in Brighton a few days later does not define us.

None of us are immune from the craziness and violence that just keeps happening over and over again. However, we all have a job to do, which is to stand up and speak up against evil when we see it. It can happen anywhere. Winthrop was just one event in one place. Our job is to do what we can to ensure that hate gets challenged wherever and whenever it shows up. It was Winthrop and Brighton. Tomorrow, it could be Weymouth or Braintree. Fighting hate is everyone's responsibility.

We may never truly know what happened that day in Winthrop, or why someone would do the things that were done by the culprit. Suffolk D.A. Rachel Rollins stated that the killer had hate in his heart. I believe the shooter had no heart, but that hate seemingly must have been housed in his mind.

We need to stop dividing and start uniting. Society is all of us together. Race, however, remembers a festering sore for all of us. We need to address the current climate in this country and start working one-by-one in improving life for all. We can't wait for the government to act we must trust ourselves. We can't live in fear and call ourselves a free people. We are not as bad as many say, but we are not as good as we need to be. That work continues.





In a letter last week, the groups demanded that the U.S. abandon its "dominant antagonistic approach" to the Chinese Communist Party, in order to work with China "to address the existential threat that is the climate crisis." The groups included MoveOn, the Sunrise Movement, and CODEPINK.

U.S. Flag is Hate Says Utah BLM

A Black Lives Matter chapter in Utah has called the U.S. Flag "a symbol of hatred" and used only by dumb racists. "When we black Americans see this flag we know the person flying it is not safe to be around," BLM Utah wrote in a Fourth of July post alongside an image of the Stars and Stripes.

"When we see this flag we know the person flying it is a racist. When we see this flag we know that the person flying it lives in a different America than we do ... When we see this flag, we question your intelligence. We know to avoid you. It is a symbol of hatred," wrote BLM Utah founder Lex Scott. The post quickly created a big uproar even among the group's own members.

Chicago Mayor Says Crime All a Lie?

A University of Chicago student blasted Chicago Mayor Lori Lightfoot for her "blatant lie" that crime in Chicago was dropping days after a University of Chicago student was killed by a stray bullet while riding a train in the city.

Audrey Unverferth, a senior, said she lost confidence in Mayor Lightfoot following the violence that held Chicago hostage over the July 4th weekend.

"Lori Lightfoot had the nerve recently to say that crime in Chicago is on the decline. That's a blatant lie," she told Fox &

Saint Melania the Younger

by Bennett Molinari and Richard Molinari

Melania was born in Rome about the year 383. She was a member of the famous family of Valerii. Her parents were Publicola and Albina. Melania married at the age of fourteen, against her will, one of her relatives, Pinianus a patrician. During her married life of seven years she had two children who died young. After their death, Melania's inclination turned toward a celibate life

She and her husband lived lives of celibacy, parting little by little with their enormous inherited wealth. She is one of history's largest benefactors to religious houses. Pinianus, who now assumed a brotherly position toward her, was her companion in all her efforts toward sanctity. Because of the Visigothic invasions of Italy, she left Rome in 408, and for two years lived near Messina in Sicily. Here, their lives assumed a monastic character and was shared by some former slaves. In 410, she went to Africa where she and Pinianus lived with her mother for seven years,



during which time she grew well acquainted with St. Augustine and his friend Alypius. She devoted herself to works of charity and piety, especially in her zeal for souls, to the foundation of a nunnery of which she became superior, and of a cloister of which Pinianus took

In 417, Melania, her mother, and Pinianus went to Palestine by way of Alexandria. For a year they lived in a hospice for pilgrims in Jerusalem, where she met St. Jerome. She again made

generous donations, upon the receipt of money from the sale of her estates in Spain. About this time she travelled in Egypt, where she visited the principal places of monastic and eremetical life, and upon her return to Jerusalem she lived for twelve years in a hermitage near the Mount of Olives. Before the death of her mother in 431, she began a new series of monastic foundations." She started with a convent for women on the Mount of Olives, of which she assumed the maintenance while refusing to be made its superior. After her husband's death, she built a cloister for men, then a chapel, and later, a more elaborate church. During this last period (Nov., 436), she went to Constantinople where she aided in the conversion of her pagan uncle, Volusian, ambassador at the Court of Theodosius II, and in the conflict with Nestorianism. She passed away on December 31, 439, in Jerusalem. The Feast Day of Saint Melania the Younger is December 31st.



THE EMPIRE STRIKES BACK: SYMPHONIC SUITE FROM THE ORIGINAL MOTION PICTURE SCORE (Vinyl) Varése Sarabande

In Celebration of Star Wars

Day 2021, Varèse Sarabande Records has re-issued the long out-of-print LP The Empire Strikes Back: Symphonic Suite from the Original Motion Picture Score by Academy Award-winning composer John Williams. Performed by the National Philharmonic Orchestra conducted by Charles Gerhardt, and out of print since 1980, the record is on black vinyl and housed in a gatefold jacket featuring the original Star Wars paintings and notes. Along with two limited exclusive versions: "Ice Planet Hoth Blue" (Vinyl Me Please) and "Imperial Grey Marble" (Newbury Comics). Originally released to supplement and not compete with the 2-LP Motion Picture Soundtrack, this 1-LP release skillfully combines a "Symphonic Suite" that John Williams created for concert performance with new arrangements of other cues from the film score. The Empire Strikes Back has become not only one of Williams' most iconic scores, but one of the most iconic film scores of all time. The LP comes in a gatefold jacket with the original iconic Star Wars paintings by William Stout, images of John Williams, and notes from author Ray Bradbury, composer and critic Christopher Palmer, and from the maestro himself. The baker's dozen tracks have: "20th Century-Fox Fanfare," "Main Title/The Imperial Probe," "Luke's First Crash," "Han Solo And The Princess," "The Asteroid Field," "The Training Of A Jedi Knight and "May The Force Be With You," ending side one via "The Battle In The Snow." Side two strikes back with: "The Imperial March," "The Magic Tree," "Yoda's Theme," "The Rebels Escape Again," "Lando's Palace, The Duel (Through The Window)," closing out with "Finale." Once again, the Empire strikes back in our ears with John Williams' musical magic.

ROY HARGROVE AND MULGREW MILLER -IN HARMONY / (2CD) Island/UMe

Resonance Records, has released In Harmony, a stunning set of live performances by Roy Hargrove on trumpet and Mulgrew Miller on piano. In Harmony provides a rare glimpse of these two now departed (at a much too early time) and dearly missed greats, united in song and improvisational mastery in front of audiences at Merkin Hall in New York City (January 15, 2006) and Lafayette College in Easton, Pennsylvania (November 9, 2007). In Harmony is the first posthumous Hargrove release since the trumpeter's untimely passing on November 2, 2018 at age 49. Miller passed away on May 29, 2013 at age 57. With In Harmony, we are back in the musical company of these two greats for a short but precious time. And though the settings heard here were ticketed

concerts, the vibe unfolds exactly as it might have back in the day at Bradley's, when Hargrove was first coming up in the late '80s and Miller loomed large from his associations with Art Blakey, Tony Williams and others. Hargrove hailed from Texas, Miller from Mississippi. In Harmony finds the two alluding to great jazz legacies in many ways, from song choices to improvisational flourishes to off-the-cuff yet impeccably placed arranging details. Highlights have the bright tempos of "What Is This Thing Called Love" and "Invitation," the majestic balladry of "I Remember Clifford" and "Never Let Me Go," or the funk of "Fungii Mama." Resonance Records' Co-President and Co-Producer of In Harmony, Zev Feldman stated, "They're playing their hearts out. I personally find these to be some of the most daring and beautiful interpretations of classic jazz repertoire I've heard. It's an honor for Resonance Records to be able to bring this music to the many fans of Roy Hargrove and Mulgrew Miller, and we thank the families for the opportunity."

ANN SWEETEN – CHANGE IS IN THE WIND / (CD) Orange Band Records

Fans of Ann Sweeten's music will delight in her newest offer-

ing, Change Is in the Wind! Sweeten's latest offering is a breathtaking and breathcatching collection of passionate instrumentals rendered with prodigious technique and mesmerizing melodic sensibility. Guest musicians include: Nancy Rumbel (English Horn), Eugene Friesen (Cello), and Charlie Bisharat (Violin). Though born out of the Pandemic, Change Is in the Wind bursts forth from the composer's soul and blooms lushly on the ears and in the mind of the listener. Sweeten finds the path to light amidst the darkness and has said in her own words: "This time, and not for a long time, my music is coming from a place of Peace. It's been kind of surreal actually, as if the heartaches of the past have been freed and I am floating in an aura of completeness, of understanding and release, "Turning the Page," as it were... Change Is in the Wind, represents a glance in the rearview mirror of my life, but, with an "Emergence" into the light and peace of the Present." Sweeten's brilliant compositions are enhanced via meticulous performances. Her smooth melodies flow nicely as she delivers tasty instrumental efforts that take New Age music to a new level. Opening with the flow of "Arctic Dance," yet exploring with "What Blooms Beneath the Snow," the significance of "May 24, 42 Years Ago," and hits the halfway mark searching for "What My Eves Can't See." Second side gems shine via the haunting "One Last October," trailed by the memory of "Forever Sunday," the ivory-tickling beauty of the title track "Change Is In the Wind," and ends appropriately with the strains of "Silver Lining."

A Nostalgic Remembrance



It will be 48 years this coming Labor Day weekend that I met Dean Saluti. I don't know if it was by accident or by fate, by that chance meeting changed my direction in life. Let me tell you how ...

During the summer of 73, I was on the road with a Motown group called the Uniques. They were coming through Boston minus a bass guitarist, and the leader called the union for help. I was recommended and a pianist named Eddie Jackson called me and asked if I would like to join them. I had nothing of any consequence happening that summer and I said OK. The Uniques were booked to play at a hotel in Caribou, Maine and I was to meet them at the Portsmouth Circle en route.

While I was waiting for them to arrive, I was thinking over the directions my life had taken since "The Good Old Days" in East Boston. I had gone to college and graduate school and had a bachelor's degree and two master's degrees. I was teaching at Hyde Park High School by day and playing music at night. At times, I would hotfoot it out to California because of receiving calls from my agent about a part in a movie or TV show.

Things were great for a single 35-year-old with not a worry in the world.

Once the rest of the band arrived, we put a conga line of cars together and headed up to Caribou, Maine. I couldn't understand why a Motown group was booked for a rural part of Maine. Up in the Caribou area the people were either potato farmers or Native Americans, mostly from the Micmac Tribe. When we arrived, I discovered that a SAC base, Loring Air Force Base, was located in Caribou, and the supper club at our hotel catered to the servicemen and civilian workers from all over the country, hence the desire for contemporary entertainment.

I stayed with the band all that summer but let the leaders know that I would be leaving just after Labor Day, as I had to return to my teaching job in Boston. A week later, Eddie Jackson told me that they had hired a bass guitarist from New York to take over once I left, and it seemed that all my ducks were in a row. As the summer was coming to an end, the New York bass player called to tell the leader of the Uniques that he could come north and take over on the Friday before Labor Day. I was now free for that Labor Day weekend.

I had given a friend some money that spring. He and a bunch of his pals were renting a cottage on Cape Cod for the Labor Day weekend, and my share of the cost insured me I had a bunk at that the Hyannis cottage they group had rented.

I left the band on the Friday morning before Labor Day, stopped at my apartment, threw my stage outfits in the washing machine, packed a suitcase with Cape Cod clothing and headed to Hyannis. When I arrived, my friend was waiting for me and we went out for a late dinner.

In the middle of the night, I was awakened by the sound of a car with a broken muffler. I jumped out of bed, looked out the window and saw a Jaguar two-seater pull up with about four people inside. Once inside, I was introduced to them, as they were part of the crowd that had chipped in for the cottage a couple of months earlier.

Considering my travels from Caribou to Cape Cod and all the goings on in between, all I wanted to do was get back to sleep. The next day, I was re-introduced to the folks from the Jaguar. The driver, Dean Saluti, and I hit it off almost immediately.

He and most of the weekend guests were employees of the Kenmore Club in Kenmore Square, then, the hottest club in Boston for nighttime entertainment. Dean was one of the bar tenders at Lucifer's, one of the three clubs in the complex. He was actually a graduate student at Boston University working on a doctorate and paying for it with the money he made mixing drinks. Following that Labor Day weekend, Dean and I began hanging out together on our off nights. We double dated, hit the other clubs in the city and more often than naught, talked about higher education.

One night, at dinner, Dean shamed me into applying for entrance to a doctoral program at B.U. Our dates egged me on, so the next afternoon I headed to Boston University and applied to take the entrance exams to get me into one of their graduate programs.

The next thing I knew, I was an in-coming "newbie" in the Department of Humanistic and Behavioral Studies. Actually I was about ten years older than the rest of the students, most going from a master's degree right into a doctoral program. Mom and Dad couldn't believe what I was doing. Babbononno, who was 98 at the time, thought I was crazy, but wished me luck anyway.

My job at Hyde Park High School was often a topic of conversation in all of the courses I was taking. The Boston Public Schools were in the middle of bussing and there were race riots at H.P. a few days a week. (Southie got all of the publicity)

A rather attractive young lady became a member of one of the courses I was in, and I made sure I was introduced. Loretta knew nothing about my status as a musician, bandleader, actor, etc. ... and wasn't impressed with my image in any way, but we began dating and in 1977, we were married at

St. Leonard's in the North End, with Dean in my wedding party. I bought a house in the suburbs and as we were redecorating with the help of our fathers, the phone rang. I put it on speaker as I had paint on my fingers and the voice on the other end identified himself as Eddie Jackson, the leader of the Uniques. They were coming through Boston, and again, needed a bass player to go on the road with them. I looked at my young wife, her father and my dad, noticing the expressions on their faces. Then bellowing into the phone, I said, "Hey man, it's all over, I can't go." Loretta and her father sighed with relief. Dad just smirked having been that route a generation earlier.

Well, that was 48 years ago give or take a month or two. Dean, for many years headed a consulting firm that went from corporate educational training to documentation for financial services. Today, he is a professor at several colleges in the Boston area. I being ten years older than everybody am retired from everything except this column.

But I have had many life experiences over the past several decades and still have the same wife, two successful sons and two grandchildren. Not bad for a street corner kid from East Boston.

Chicken Marsala is a classic Italian American dish that was found on the menu in most Italian restaurants in this country, from the 1950's through to the late '80s. This dish, as we know it today is a combination of influences, which make it difficult for anyone to establish a single origin. Chefs in Sicily cook with Marsala wine, but it is



typically used to braise pork or lamb. Food historians believe the dish bears a strong French influence and speculate the sauce may have come from the French chefs Queen Maria Carolina of Naples and Sicily imported in the early 1800's, to cook for her court. Others claim the dish is simply a variation of the traditional Italian scaloppini dishes, of which there are many varieties throughout Italy. Regardless of its origin, what we do know for sure is Chicken Marsala is a dish most Italian-Americans continue to love!

Marsala wine comes from Sicily, so it comes as no surprise that my Nonna used it to cook and bake with. Anytime she was cooking with this wine, you'd know it immediately by the magnificent smell of dried fruit, caramel and nuts that would instantly emanate from her kitchen. She used this sweet wine to make *Scaloppine a Marsala*, *Zabaglione*, in Tiramisu and in her version of the Chicken Marsala found in this country. Nonna's recipe for Chicken Marsala is a quick and easy dish to make, uses few simple ingredients, and is delicious when served over pasta or arborio rice. Whatever your preference, be it pasta or rice, I assure you this Chicken Marsala will be a dish that most of your family and friends will love!

CHICKEN MARSALA Pollo al Marsala

4 pounds of thin sliced chicken cutlets, pounded and cut into 2-3 inch pieces (you can leave them whole if you prefer)
Salt and freshly ground pepper 1 cup all-purpose flour 1 to 1½ sticks butter
¾ to 1½ cups olive oil
4-6 garlic, pressed

chicken broth as needed 2-3 large shallots, sliced thin

2 16-ounce containers of Baby Bella mushrooms, sliced

3 cups Marsala wine

2 pounds arborio rice or pasta, cooked

Additional butter, olive oil and/ or Marsala wine, as needed

Season chicken with salt and pepper and dredge in flour. Heat ½ cup oil and 4 teaspoons butter in a large sauté pan over mediumhigh heat. Working in batches, add chicken in a single layer and cook, turning once, until golden brown. Transfer cooked chicken to a flat plate and set aside.

In the same large sauté pan over medium heat, add 1 stick of butter with $\frac{1}{2}$ cup oil. When butter has melted, add garlic, cook until fragrant, then add shallots, cook until soft, add mushrooms and cook all together for about 7 to 8 minutes.

To this pan, add the chicken and Marsala wine. Cook for about 7 to 10 minutes, then lower the heat to a simmer. Add the chicken broth, 2 more teaspoons of butter, salt and freshly ground pepper to taste, and cook low for about 20 to 25 more minutes, or until the sauce appears to have thickened and mushrooms have softened. You can add more butter, Marsala wine and/or chicken broth, if needed.

Serve over pasta or arborio rice and enjoy!

Woodstock



Woodstock has become a national folklore and, truth be told, there never will be another concert like it. It could only have happened in 1969, when rock bands were at a turning point, the Beatles had just released the White Album and the Summer of Love was still in the air.

On August 15th of that year, a dairy farm in Bethel, NY became the site in which close to 500,000 people would gather for a three-day concert that would become a milestone in American

John Roberts, Joel Rosenman, Artie Kornfeld, and Michael Lang, the creators of the "Aquarian Experience" (as it was billed) had scouted out Wallkill, New York as the venue to host the music festival, but the local officials soon prohibited it. They continued to scout for a venue until Max Yasgur, a dairy farmer, loaned out his farmlands in Bethel, New York.

It didn't take long for a major band, Creedence Clearwater Revival to sign on. Once names of big bands started making headlines, crowds started gathering around the venue and any hope the hosts had of creating ticket stands were soon dashed by the sheer multitude of the crowds. And so, Woodstock became one of the largest free concerts in history.

The weather was misty and damp, but that didn't stop the near half million who traveled by foot, car, or train to get to the concert. Most were young, many were hippies, and all carried the emotional baggage of the decade; the escalating war in Vietnam, the Civil Rights Movement and an escape from the conformities of

Police presence was limited and medical workers remained on the outskirts in tents, yet no violence broke out, and of the two deaths — one was a freak accident while the other was an

Among the legendary performers at the festival were Arlo Guthrie (fresh off the success of Alice's Restaurant), Joan Baez, Santana, the Grateful Dead, Janis Joplin, Sly and the Family Stone, Jefferson Airplane, The Who, Jimi Hendrix, Crosby Stills Nash & Young, and Blood Sweat & Tears. Among those who had to back out were John Lennon, Simon & Garfunkel and the Rolling

Hendrix would close the concert, but its legacy never died. The very ground in which it was held has become hallowed ground and continues to have concerts, sometimes for some of the very bands that first performed there in 1969.

Still Time to Plant Vegetables

by Melinda Myers

Now is the time to plan and plant vegetables for a bountiful fall harvest. Planting now extends the harvest season for greater yield without expanding the garden.

Start by looking for vacant spaces in the vegetable garden. Fill areas that were not planted this spring or replant rows of quick maturing vegetables like lettuce, spinach, radishes, and beets that have already been harvested. Expand your search to other vacant spaces in flowerbeds, mixed borders, and containers.

Select vegetables that will have sufficient time to reach maturity before your growing season ends. Simply count the number of days from planting to the date of the average first fall frost in your area. Those in frost-free areas can plant longer season crops that benefit from maturing during the cooler months of fall.

Second plantings can be started from seeds or plants, if available. Check the back of the seed packet or plant tag to find out how many days each plant variety needs to grow and produce. Add a few weeks to allow time for harvesting. As long as there is enough time for the seeds to sprout, grow, and produce before the end of your growing season, they can be added to the garden.

Fill your late season garden with lots of variety. Include root crops like beets, carrots, radishes, and turnips. Greens like leaf lettuce, spinach, collards, kale, and chard provide the basis for a great fall salad and some make great additions to stir fries. Try onions, kohlrabi, cucumbers, broccoli, cauliflower, cabbage, and sweet corn for some variety. Just make sure the seeds or transplants will have enough time to grow and produce.

Some vegetables like broccoli, cauliflower, and Brussels







EZZARD CHARLES

Former Heavyweight Champ — Born One Hundred Years Ago

July 7th marked the 100th anniversary of the birth of Ezzard Charles. Long considered one of the most underrated champions of all time, Charles is now recognized as an all-time great.

Ezzard started his professional boxing career as a middleweight in 1940, and weighed

181 pounds when he won the vacant heavyweight title by defeating Jersey Joe Walcott in 1949. The title had been left open with the retirement of Joe Louis. Charles would fight Joe Louis, who had made a comeback in 1950 in a brutal 15 round bout with Ezzard getting the decision.

Charles proved his greatness time and again with wins over the likes of Charley Burley, Lloyd Marshall, Archie Moore, Elmer Ray, Jimmy Bivins, Joey Maxim, and Gus Lesnevich. This was in addition to his victories of Walcott and Louis.

In 1954, the former champ took on Rocky Marciano in a bid to regain the title. In a bruising, fifteen round battle Rocky was the clear winner, but it was his toughest defense. Charles would be the only challenger to go fifteen rounds with the Brockton Blockbuster.

In a rematch later that same year Rocky kayoed Charles in the 8th round, but not before being severely cut on his nose, a cut that nearly caused the fight to be stopped.

After the second Marciano fight, Charles continues fighting, but lost more than he won. He had his last fight in 1959. It was another sad case of a once great former champ being reduced to opponent status while fighting for short money.

In 1968, he was diagnosed with ALS, also known as Lou Gehrig's disease. The courageous Charles fought on until succumbing to the insidious illness in 1975 at the age of 53.

Rocky Marciano called his former challenger the bravest man he ever fought. That was true both in the ring and out.



There he was. In command again. Not taking over a team that had performed below expectations. And, to be fair, not one that people would place in the pantheon of organizations that have a long and storied history.

That's because it doesn't. But it is a genesis. A start.

To be present at a creation is to have an entire world of possible outcomes arrayed before you.

Yes, even one of the most remembered coaches in the history of the game was aware of that — even if it was only in miniature.

Coming out to start a period, Herb Brooks, a legend in his own time behind the bench at the University of Minnesota and the head coach of the 1980 Team USA "Miracle on Ice" squad would often gaze upon the newly resurfaced and unblemished surface and remark "all I see are possibilities."

And thus, it is with Dave Hakstol, the former college coach who created an empire at the University of North Dakota, left it all to chase a dream as a head coach in the National Hockey League, and then experienced a downslide before being rescued by the echoes of expansion.

So there, there where it was beginning for the very first time, where there was no history and only hope, sat one David Hakstol, the newly appointed head coach of the Seattle Kraken, now leader of a team that has yet to play a game but has captured the imagination of thousands in the Pacific Northwest.

A bright moment for Hakstol, whose career path we have often compared with that of David Quinn, the former head coach of Boston University and the New York Rangers. We say that because we think it indicates that there are better times ahead for David, as he sits at home contemplating his future, after before shown the rear door in New York earlier this spring.

As college coaches they were superb. Hakstol spent 15 seasons at North Dakota, which, we later read in a newspaper's travel section, is the least visited state in the United States. All he did was establish an empire in a state that did not have a single big-time pro franchise.

Over the course of a dramatic 11-year span (2004-2015), Hakstol took his team all the way to the Frozen Four seven times, a truly outstanding accomplishment. However, UND never won, advancing to the title contest only once, in 2005, when they were beaten by the University of Denver.

Perhaps the penultimate clash between Hakstol and Quinn came in the 2015 Frozen Four semifinals at the TD Garden where the two powerful programs went at it in a showdown game. That night the Terriers emerged the victors over UND, which had 14 NHL draft picks sprinkled across its roster.

We will long remember the stunned look on the UND players at the postgame press conference. It was one of the Terriers' biggest victories in years but they still came up short, losing to Providence College in the title game two nights later.

The game against BU would also turn out to be Hakstol's last college game. Within weeks, he had signed on to coach the Philadelphia Flyers, leaving behind the state where he was the most popular person.

There were millions of reasons to make the move and each one had George Washington's portrait on it. But money isn't everything and this would be an example that illustrated that point.

First UND did win a national championship — in 2016, the year after he left with his veteran assistant behind the bench. Secondly, the Flyers were pedestrian at best under his leadership, twice being wiped out of the playoffs in the first round and once not even able to qualify.

Hakstol was fired in 2018 and later was selected as an assistant with Toronto by head coach Mike Babcock. Babcock was later let go but Hakstol remained an assistant until hired by the Kraken.

But now, as the coach of the most recent expansion team, the challenge will be to follow (to some extent) the successful path of the Vegas Golden Knights who finished atop the Western Conference in their inaugural year with a 51-24-7 record and went to the 2018 Stanley Cup Final.

Meanwhile that 2014-2015 season did turn out to be Quinn's pinnacle in college. The Terriers not only went to the Frozen Four championship game, they also won the Beanpot and captured both the Hockey East regular season and tournament titles. At the conclusion of that 28-8-5 campaign Quinn was named the Hockey East Coach of the Year, the New England Coach of the Year, and was the runner-up for the Spencer Penrose Award (National Coach of the Year).

After that well-remembered victory over UND, he went on to lead the Terriers for three more seasons before leaving in May, 2018 for the Rangers.

He was well on his way to successfully extending the winning ways of legendary former head coach Jack Parker when he opted for the cash, potential glory, and the uncertainty of lengths of employment that all pro coaches must deal with.

When Quinn took the job, the Rangers had a philosophy of attempting to develop younger players rather than dealing for veterans. In the end, the philosophy of management changed to one of urgency and David was out of a job for doing what he was asked to do.

So while Quinn is idle, Hakstol is getting ready for the debut season of his team. One of his first moves was to hire Jay Leach, the head coach of the Providence Bruins, as one of his assistant coaches.

Leach, a former defenseman who had an 11-year career in the NHL, coached the P-B's for four seasons, compiled a 136-77-26 record and had the team competing in the Calder Cup Playoffs every season.

Quinn seems to be just a step behind Hakstol as his career path plays out. Of the two, Hakstol was first hired by the NHL, first fired by the NHL, and then rehired by other NHL teams.

Now it is Quinn who must wait. He has been both hired and fired. We hope his return is not that far from becoming a reality.
