#### GOP Senator Backs Limit on Card APRs

U.S. Sen. Josh Hawley from Missouri plans on introducing legislation that would set an 18 percent cap on credit card interest rates.

Hawley denounced soaring interest rates, which hit an average above 24 percent this month, as credit card debt levels surpassed \$1 trillion. Hawley added, "Americans are being crushed under the weight of record credit card debt." He also pointed out it was time for the government to serve working people just as it came to the aid of faltering banks earlier this year.



### NORTH END PASSED OVER Museum Update Final decision 9/20/2023

#### School Choice Talk Like Segregation?

American Federation **of Teachers** (AFT) President Randi Weingarten likened the rhetoric of supporters of school-choice and parental rights initiatives to that of segregationists and her words sparked an outcry from parents seeking good education for their children. Comparing the parental rights movement in this nation to Jim Crow-era racists did not as expected go over well with many very irate parents.

#### McCarthy Says Biden Policies "Destroy Our Borders"

House Speaker Kevin McCarthy ripped the Biden Administration over the migrant crisis that is overwhelming New York City. The Speaker said that Biden has "destroyed our borders." #### STATEMENT FROM THE BOSTON PLANNING I DEVELOPMENT AGENCY (BPDA)

The Boston Planning & Development Agency (BPDA) on Wednesday, September 20<sup>th</sup>, announced the selection of Toussaint Louverture Cultural Center (TLCC) to operate the program space located at 131 Beverly Street on Lovejoy Wharf. The BPDA sought respondents that were qualified to operate civic/cultural space, which is designed as a visitor's center-style facility. The TLCC responded to the Request for Letters of Interest (RFI) that was originally released by the BPDA last winter, with their proposal to use the space for Haitian-based programs, partners, and communities.



#### THE CLOSE SHAVE IN OLD ROME

The Greeks during Homeric times regarded the beard as a sign of virility. They considered clean shaving to be disgraceful and a sign of effeminacy. Even in early Jewish times, it was quite common for one person to touch the beard of the other during conversation. This reminds me of that part of an earlier column which stated that dancers of antiquity took hold of each other by the chlamys.

In Rome, it became quite common and fashionable to shave the beard partially, and then carefully groom it. The long untrimmed beard was considered the mark of a foul, filthy, and untidy person. Many were even referred to as "he goats," Shaving was almost a religious rite, and a state duty to the Romans. Nothing stood in the way of the ordeal that was the daily visit with the barber. As soon as a young man reached maturity, his facial hairs received their first cut with scissors, and he was then introduced to the razor. A male's first shave was considered to be the beginning of manhood and was cause for celebration. The dates on which emperors and other notables first were shorn have been recorded in history. Augustus was twenty-four at the time of his first shave and Caligula was twenty. Even Nero put his shorn hair into a golden box and dedicated it to a god.

During the rule of Constantine and continuing to the end of the sixth century, all rulers with the exception of Julian are shown clean-shaven. It was the Roman custom to let the beard grow in time of mourning, as did Augustus, after the death of Julius Caesar. Later when the beard was shaved off, a season of festivity was declared. Many wealthy persons had slaves

who were trained specifically in the tonsorial art, but the more common people had to go to a "tonstrina" or barber shop. Shaving was done with a "novacula" or razor. It was sharpened on a special stone imported from Spain, and was lubricated by spit. Beard softeners were unheard of and soap was not used. Everyone was given the "dry shave." Imagine for a moment the plight of the poor man who is getting a dry shave while sitting on a stool in the middle of a busy sidewalk and the barber is being continually pushed and shoved by the passing crowds.

Bloodletting was kept to a minimum when the most famous barbers worked at a snail's pace. It was said in jest that while barbers trimmed around the ears a second beard grew. One Roman remedy for razor nicks was spider's webs soaked in oil and vinegar.

Then there were those cowards who couldn't take the barber and resorted to the use of depilatories like resin and pitch, or pastes made from donkey fat, she goat's gall, bat's blood or powdered viper. For those who could take neither the razor nor the depilatory there was always the tweezer. Finally, there was the tonsorial masochist who had part of his beard shaved, part depilatorized, and part tweezed. This ought to provide food for thought while shaving.

The customer was also sprayed with perfume, makeup cream was applied to his face, pimples, and blemishes, or razor cuts were covered with little spots of flesh-tinted cloth. These Roman pasties were called "splenia lunata" or in good old English, "patches." When the ordeal was completed, the victim was returned to society looking like a clown, smelling like a pansy and given a wide berth for the rest of the day.

Before the middle of the second century, most of the Roman men were revolting against their enslavement to the barber. Emperor Hadrian became the liberator by letting his beard grow in order to hide an ugly scar. No further encouragement was needed. All men followed his example and the daily shave disappeared from their routine causing no regret.

These bills are currently before the Joint Committee on State Administration and Regulatory Oversight.

The House Bill, **H2989**, is being Sponsored by Rep Christine Barber (D), Somerville and the Senate Bill, **S1976**, is being Sponsored by Sen Joanne Comerford (D), Northampton.

#### October 3, 2023 at the State House Gardner Auditorium 11:00 a.m.-2:00 p.m.

It will be posted on the State House web page 1 week before the hearing. Speakers will have 3 minutes to present their position.

We will keep you apprised of any new details that may occur.

As you remember, last year, thanks to your calls and emails to the legislature, the IDP bills died in committee and it is our intention to do the best we can to see that these bills and ballot initiatives fail again this year.

(There is also a **petition** being circulated to create a **referendum ballot** for the 2024 elections to **replace Columbus Day** with IDP Day. **They need 75,000 signatures before November 22, 2023**.)

We are committed to fighting the cancel culture movement that has *unfairly seized upon Columbus as their scapegoat*. These attacks are based upon lies and misinformation about his role in the history that followed the discovery of the New World.

We will continue educating people about Christopher Columbus so they can better understand that eliminating him from our history is unnecessary and hurtful to the Italian American community and to all Americans.

As we did last year, the IAA has taken the lead in monitoring these situations. We will keep you informed and don't hesitate to let us know how you can help. (One way is let your legislator know that you are not in favor of his or her supporting such a bill. email their office.)

### **NEW Health's North End Site** Open and OperatingDuring Renovations

Dear North End Patients and Community Members,

We know you've seen the scaffolding outside our building since the summer – but we want to ensure you that NEW Health's North End site is *open and operating* during renovations. All services are still being provided; select services are temporarily moved to our Charlestown location.

The City of Boston Inspectional Services Department and the George Robert White Fund, that manages the building, have confirmed that the building is structurally sound and safe for occupancy.

As promised, we will continue to keep the community updated along the way. The new roof installation process that began in August is taking longer than anticipated and will now wrap up in the coming months. The rest of the health center remains open; however, our dental and vision departments will continue to be provided at our Charlestown site at 15 Tufts Street. Our podiatry services remain in the North End but

have been moved to the first floor. Dental, vision and podiatry services are *not* being discontinued.

Patients who have scheduled appointments in dental, vision and podiatry during this project will receive updates via Patient Gateway or phone. If you need an appointment in any of our departments or have questions about your care, do not hesitate to call the health center at 617-643-8000.







### L'Anno Bello: A Year in Italian Folklore A Harvest of Balance on the Equinox

After a stifling hot summer, during which even five-minute walks in the sweltering sun immediately drove me back to the air-conditioned interiors of my home, I was relieved when one morning dawned overcast and cool. Finally, the smell of September — that wonderful month when the leaves begin to blush with shades of red and gold, and chilly nights creep in cat-like with their early darkness — permeated the air. Wherever I turn my head, it seems signs of autumn wink at me playfully, announcing the presence of the season with a crisp and snappy flair. Juicy apples lent their tartness to an old-fashioned crisp I baked for my family not too long ago. Scarecrows smile from store shelves, their broad grins and crackly hair joyfully heralding the feasts to come. Leaves shine in the slick pavement after a rainfall. There will even soon be a carton of iced pumpkin spice coffee sitting in my refrigerator, waiting for me to enjoy its creamy goodness. These hallmarks of fall intensify as we near the autumn equinox, which this year occurs on Saturday, September 23<sup>rd</sup>. This equinox embodies the rhythm that pulses throughout the fall, its measured dance of harvest and community and interplay between light and dark. Indeed, the autumn equinox is celebrated throughout the world, including Italy, as a seasonal marker and as a significant date in which people honor the generosity of the Earth.

The autumn equinox falls

people may mourn the end of the astronomical summer and its idyllic, carefree nature, it is important to look at the autumn equinox as an opportunity to begin anew. The return to work and school fills the air with a sense of purpose and organization, a feeling that will guide us as the cadence of autumn eventually dissipates into the jollity of the holidays. Since autumn brims with renewal, it is little wonder that many cultures begin their new year around the equinox. One such example is Rosh Hashanah, the Jewish New Year, which began on the evening of September 15th this year and is celebrated with meals of apples and honey to ensure the sweetness of the upcoming year. However, the equinox also signifies another important time change: while the day of the equinox consists of equal hours of day and night, after this date the darkness will overwhelm the light. The darkness beckons me indoors, to cozy evenings spent with my family and friends as our stories and laughter form a barrier against the dim night. I may even spend the early nights alone baking with the abundant produce of autumn, filling my kitchen with warm and spicy scents. The equinox affords us opportunities to reconnect with our families and our deepest selves, to devote time to projects and hobbies and take pleasure in the spirit of the season, which is at once both communal and introspective.

In addition to the turning of time, the autumn equinox is about halfway between the also a wonderful time to pay homage to the bounty of the summer and winter solstices, and as such is used to indicate Earth. In Europe, the last colthe passage of time. While some lection of harvest takes place

around the time of the equinox. Our Italian ancestors, living off the land in a primarily agricultural society, may have waited until the Harvest Moon to finish harvesting their crops. The Harvest Moon, or the full moon closest to the equinox, illuminated the fields sufficiently so that farmers could work well into the night. This year, the Harvest Moon occurs on September 29<sup>th</sup>, and as usual, I will celebrate the occasion by baking my appropriately-named Harvest Moon cookies, or almond cookies half-dipped in melted chocolate. As the harvest ended in Europe, many cultures would ritualistically cut the last sheaf of grain, a practice which stems from ancient times, when people believed that the goddess of the grain was embodied in the final remaining bundle. It was then time for cozy feasts known as "Harvest Home," which still exist to this day and can be seen in the harvest fairs that dot event calendars throughout the fall. For Harvest Home, the community gathers together at tables laden with the foods of autumn - apples, pumpkins, pears, carrots, nuts, ginger, spices — and celebrate the generosity of the land and the fruits of their labors. In Italy, these kinds of feasts often take the form of *sagre*. Derived from the Latin word "sacrum," which also lends itself to the English word "sacred," sagre are festivals devoted to a specific crop or product. Italians love their sagre, and the various regions of Italy each have feasts that honor a local delicacy. Villages in Northern Italy, for example, may host sagre di mele — apple festivals - while Southern Italians often honor grapes in their sagre di uve. No matter what autumnal staple is being celebrated, these European feasts remind us that good food, a strong sense of community, and the love of family are sacred treasures indeed. This equinox, let's bring back

a sense of balance and purpose to our lives by enjoying the season. Rather than bemoan the darkness, we can welcome it by resolving to use nighttime as an opportunity to do something that makes us happy -whether it involves spending extra time with our families and friends or crafting some alone time in which we may develop our interests and hobbies. We can honor the bounty of the Earth by enjoying the fruits of all and truly relishing them, slowly biting into a tart and juicy apple and inhaling the spicy scent of a cinnamonflecked cider. Moreover, we can spread the love of the Earth by donating our time or our food to those less fortunate. Let us carry the lessons of the equinox to our heart, and then the pleasures of fall will always have a home-a harvest home, if you will — inside our souls. 

We may not realize it but lots of things we take for granted in life have changed radically over our lifetimes. The first time I became aware of a change in technology was when Mom bought a new vacuum cleaner. After Babbononno sold the big house on Eutaw Street and moved Nanna into a rented apartment a few streets away, we moved two doors away from the original house to 74 Eutaw. Mom had an upright Hoover vacuum cleaner and when she would plug it in and throw the switch a long black bag would swell up and the dirt that was swept up went into the bag while the suction motor whined away.

One day, a man brought a canister shaped vacuum cleaner up the three flights of stairs to our top floor apartment and gave Mom a demonstration about the new technology. It was an Electrolux that sat on the floor with runners allowing it to glide along. Attached to the front of the machine was a long flexible hose that ended in an opening that could accommodate an assortment of removable brushes that did the cleaning while the internal motor sucked up the dirt. Dad bought the machine, and for the next week or so, neighbors came by to see the space age design and what it could do.

When we all lived together in the big house, Monday was wash day. Mom and Nanna would fill one side (the deep side) of the kitchen sink with water and add in Rinso White, Super Suds, Duz, or Lux flakes, slide in a wash board submerge all of the clothes to be washed. They were soaked in the sudsy water and scrubbed against the corrugated face of the wash board until they were considered clean. From there, they were piled up in the shallow side of the sink, rinsed and rung out by hand to extract all of the water and remaining soap. From there, they were hung out on a close line in the back yard to dry. During the winter months, the clothes would freeze on the line and look like dried pieces of baccala. After the first year living at #74, Dad bought a modern washing machine, a cube shaped apparatus with a round door on the front. It was connected to the water supply that could fill the tank with hot, cold or a mix of measured water. When the door was open, Mom would throw in the clothes to be washed, a measured out portion of special soap that didn't suds up like the others did that were used in the sink, and with the touch of a button, the cylindrical center of the machine would start to fill with water and then spin washing the clothes. The end of the spinning process would par dry the clothes and they would then be hung out the window on a close line that was connected to a pole at the back of the yard to complete the drying process. Actually, there was room for the washer, but no place to add in a dryer.

To warm a house or apartment today, we set a thermostat to a particular temperature and experience the comfort we want. The water supply was heated in a tank due to a similar control that allows the user to regulate the heat of the water. When we moved into that 3rd floor apartment, the heat in the apartment was supplied by a stove that burned range oil. Behind the stove was a dish shaped base that held a three gallon container filled with range oil that Dad would fill from a 50 gallon drum in the cellar. The oil would wet cloth coils within the stove and as they burned, they heated the house. The right side of the stove was the cooking end and was operated by natural gas. Both bedrooms which were right off the kitchen and were usually kept warm by the stove during the cold months, but the living room was too far away. Luckily, this room had a radiator that was heated by the heating system that warmed the 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> floors. The water in the sink and bathroom was heated when needed. On the right side of the stove was a stack heater. It was a black metal cylinder about 2 or 3 feet high with a door in the front. When the door was open, we would light a burner at the base of the cylinder and voila, a half hour later, we had hot water.

Years later, Dad would install an automatic oil pump that eliminated the three gallon jug. It was also connected to the stack heater and automatically, we had both heat and hot water. Life was made easier.

On a shelf near the kitchen table sat a small radio and each afternoon, I would listen to the 15 minute serials: Superman, Tom Mix, Bobby Benson and the B Bar B Ranch and Captain Midnight. If Dad had run out of cigarettes, during a commercial, I could take the twenty cents he gave me for the purchase of a pack of Old Golds, run down the 3 flights of steps, run to the corner store, buy his cigarettes, run home and be back just as the story was ready to continue. I was fast. By 1948, things changed. Ralph Manfredonia, the landlord, bought a television. From that point on, I would be at his house in the afternoon with his children watching the kid's shows on the 7 inch screen of his set. In 1949, Dad bought a Philco TV with a giant 12 inch screen. Over time, the radio collected dust on the kitchen shelf.

Dad had always been one for innovations. He shaved with an electric razor, something I never got used to using. When they first came out, he bought one, liked it so much, he gave his straight razor to Grandpa Christoforo as an extra and never went back to a blade again.

During the summer when it became oppressive in a 3<sup>rd</sup> floor apartment, Dad would bring from our storage area in the cellar, window fans that would keep each room in the house cool, or at least blow the hot air around to make it more comfortable.

The milk was delivered several times a week by the Shawmut Diary and later, Hoods after Shawmut folded. There were street vendors who had horse drawn wagons and sold everything in the way of fruits and vegetables. The only bread you could buy from a street vendor was Cushman's and it was American bread sold from the back of their trucks. Only the non-Italians in the neighborhood bought American bread When it came to cars, Dad was more traditional. The cars he bought had standard transmissions, with column shifts and a clutch on the floor. He didn't trust the automatics, and besides, they were only offered in the expensive cars. In the 50s, power steering, power brakes, and power windows were offered, but Dad didn't trust their reliability. It wasn't until the late 50s that he bought a car with power options. It would be another 10 years before one of Dad's cars had air conditioning, but I don't think he ever used it. Most of what we lived with back then is gone, but the memories linger on. There were no TV remotes, no climate controls in homes and no all power type options in cars. Guess what ... we survived.

#### NEOPOLITAN STROMBOLI Stromboli Napoletano



#### **Dough for Two Stromboli (A perfect dough for any Stromboli):** 4 cups flour

- $1 \frac{1}{2}$  cups water
- 1 package or 2 ¼ teaspoons active dry yeast
- 1 ½ teaspoons sea salt
- 1 to 2 tablespoons olive oil (to coat bowl)

Put water in a small bowl and add the yeast, stir until dissolved. In a large bowl, whisk together the flour and salt. Add the yeast mixture and stir until a soft dough forms. If the dough is too dry, add a little extra water, one tablespoon at a time. If it's too sticky, add extra flour, one tablespoon at a time.

Transfer the dough to a floured work surface and knead with floured hands for about 10-12 minutes (you can also use a dough hook on an electric mixer) until it becomes smooth and elastic.

Drizzle the olive oil inside a clean bowl and place the dough in it, cover loosely with plastic wrap and a kitchen towel.

Set the bowl in a warm place for approximately 2 hours, or until the dough doubles in size.

Deflate the dough in the center using your fist, then divide it into two equal-sized pieces.

Shape each piece into a ball and place them in separate oiled bowls.

Cover each bowl loosely with plastic wrap and a kitchen towel and let them rest for 1 hour.

*Optional: roasted red peppers or sliced banana peppers Note: You can use any combination of Italian deli meats that you'd like,* 

#### Egg Wash:

1 egg beaten with 1-tablespoon water.

Preheat your oven to 400°F. Line a baking sheet with parchment paper, set aside.

When dough is ready, roll each ball on a lightly floured surface until it forms a rectangle shape, about 12x16 inches in size.

On each, layer the cheese, then the meat slices on top. If desired, add any additional fillings such as roasted or sliced peppers (I did not use any).

Starting from one of the longer sides, carefully roll up the Stromboli tightly into a log shape, sealing the ends by pinching them together.

Transfer the Stromboli, spaced apart, onto the prepared baking sheet. Brush with egg wash and bake for approximately 20-25 minutes or until golden brown and crispy on the outside.

Remove from the oven and let cool for about 10 to 15 minutes before slicing.


### THOUGHTS BY DAN **ABOUT THIS & THAT**

#### Joseph Conrad and His Demons

A paradox runs across the latter period of Joseph Conrad's career in which many of his characteristic themes, notably the conflicts of the heart upon the realization of the horrors and brutality tied to a livelihood. Superficially, Conrad was branching out, delving more into the politics of Eastern Europe with The Secret Agent and, its spiritual successor, Under Western Eyes. Both deal with the rise of political terrorism as Russia was rising from the failed revolution of 1905 to its history making one more than a decade later. Both novels, however, are centered on a theme central to Conrad's work, the moral dilemma of the protagonist torn between duty and ethics.

His short story collection, 'Twixt Land and Sea, comprising stories written around these two later works, looks at the conundrums Conrad was exploring since Heart of Darkness from different angles. "The Secret Sharer," one of his most famous short stories is, at first reading, a simple tale. The new captain of a commercial ship picks off a fugitive from another English vessel encountered off the coast of Manila. Leggatt, the fugitive, was charged with murder on the vessel he fled from and execution once the ship docks is almost certain. The captain that takes him in feels a kinship with this stowaway that can only be explained by the striking physical similarities he bears with the fugitive. Indeed, this captain (who remains unnamed, so his identity is all the less distinguishable to that of Leggatt), who has up to now been described as insecure and uneasy with his own position as captain, identifies with the fugitive he harbors and his motives (Leggatt murdered a crew member, whose stubbornness and arrogance during a storm would have sunk the ship) more than anyone he commands. So intense does the captain's identification with Leggatt become that he violates maritime law, lies to his crew and even endangers them to hide the murderer with his face. "A Smile of Fortune," written shortly after, is one of Conrad's most fascinating tales. Again the story centers around a somewhat naïve captain of a merchant vessel stationed in Mauritius. He is assigned by the owners of the ship to meet while there with Ernst Jacobus, a local ship supplier well regarded in Mauritius as well as among merchant sailors. However, the captain is instead approached first by Ernst's brother Alfred. This is in its own way a return to the concept of dualities explored in "Secret Sharer" but while the captain of that story saw himself in Leggatt, Alfred insists that his brother is a very "different kind of person". Alfred is odd but congenial and, like his brother, well-known among the local traders. However, his dismaying reputation on the island, which begins to spread to the captain by association (are they too starting to be seen




as one?) suggests Alfred has a scandalous history.

Once the captain does meet Ernst, it is hard to see why he should not be regarded at least as lowly as his brother. He is hot-headed, scolding and, most unforgivingly, brutal with the young biracial man who waits on him. Inexplicably, the locals overlook this willingly. In fact, what the captain does learn about Ernst deepens the mystery. The biracial young man is, in fact, Ernst's son, the result he cannot hide from an affair he would rather be forgotten, hence his animosity.

But Alfred, what is it with Alfred and why can't his sins (whatever they are) be forgiven as easily as his brother's?

Here the reader is also torn. We want Alfred to emerge triumphant as the better man because everything we have seen of him to this point shapes him into the man Ernst should be. And yet, his story reveals a man who is in some ways far more calculating and crueler than his brother. He too had an adulterous past, leaving his wife for a circus performer. Alice, the daughter born of this romance, is his own secret child. But while Alfred's treatment of Alice has not the obvious violence his brother employs it is, in its own way, just as sinister, again the central question of how different we are than the brutes we condemn.

Alice is Alfred's secret. She never leaves the house, spending most of her time in the flower garden. Her years living as a recluse have turned her paranoid, misanthropic and wild. Her only link to the outside world are newspapers, her spinster aunt and the sailors that come to the house to



conduct business with her father. Alfred has often talked of sending her abroad but his reasons for delaying this soon become apparent to the captain and began to repulse him. Alice's beauty and mysterious vulnerability draw the merchant sailors in, keeping them on the island where their supply needs can be met by her father.

At this point in the narrative, there is no longer a question as to why Alfred is scorned by the locals. The conflict is now within the captain. He is disgusted by Alfred but cannot, despite many threats to do so, walk away from Alice. Knowingly and begrudgingly, he is falling for Alfred's exploitative financial scheme.

Throughout his life, Conrad was torn by the beauty of exotic foreign lands, the riches they held and the romance of adventures at sea. But he was brave enough to acknowledge the crimes against his fellow man committed for the sake of such things. To what extent was he complicit?, he dared ask himself. It is a question that seemingly troubled him his whole life. As the captain in "A Smile of Fortune" asked himself, "Horrid thoughts of business interfered with my enjoyment of an accomplished passage."

#### Daffodils with a Difference by Melinda Myers

There are so many reasons to love daffodils. These springblooming bulbs aren't fussy about where they are planted. They come back to bloom again year after year and are not bothered by deer, rabbits, or other garden pests. But there's also a whole world of beautiful daffodils beyond the classic yellow ones. Daffodils are available in unusual flower styles and unexpected colors that can bring a whole new look to spring gardens.

Get an early start on next vear's daffodil season with Barrett Browning, a variety with pure white petals and brilliant red-orange trumpets. It is an excellent choice for naturalizing. Pink Charm also boasts white petals but has a large coral-pink trumpet with ruffled edges. It is considered one of the best pink daffodils and is known for its vigor and reliability.

Add eye-catching color with the dependable heirloom Red Devon's brilliant yellow petals and flashy orange cups. For a more subtle approach, choose the pastel hues of British Gamble. Its white petals are a perfect backdrop for the ruffled peachy-pink trumpet on these enormous, 5" blossoms.

Change the shape of things with some split trumpet daffodils. Cassata is a strong grower with a ruffled lemonyellow cup that lies almost flat against broad white petals. Cum Laude boasts big, bright, extra frilly flowers with peachy accents. Lemon Beauty's flowers feature pure white petals, and its split trumpet resembles a bright yellow star.

Double daffodils add elegance to gardens and spring floral arrangements. They also stretch the season by blooming several weeks later than most other types. La Torch's upward-facing fragrant double flowers are a mix of yellow petals and bright orange ruffles. Delnashaugh is a late-blooming double with layers of pure white petals interspersed with apricot-pink ruffles. Lingerie's extra-large blooms have thickly ruffled centers of white and golden yellow petals.

Some daffodils produce a bouquet of blossoms on each stem. Pueblo grows just twelve inches tall, and its primrose yellow flowers gradually fade to creamy white. Beautiful Eyes has two to three flowers per stem, with white petals, bright orange cups and a gardenia-like fragrance.

Tuck them into rock gardens, under shrubs, along paths, in containers, and mix them with other spring flowering bulbs and perennials. Tête-à-tête has perky, bright yellow blossoms and grows just 7" tall. Tête Bouclé is similar in size, but its double flowers display layers of yellow, gold, and green petals.

Jet Fire is another outstanding miniature daffodil. It has bright orange trumpets and golden yellow swept-back petals and is a great small-scale naturalizer in the landscape. Minnow is an adorable little gem with paleyellow petals and bright yellow trumpets. Sundisc's petite flowers have pale yellow petals and an almost flat, deep yellow trumpet. Miniature daffodils are a particularly good choice for perennials gardens, where they won't overwhelm neighboring plants.

Though mainly remembered in the United States for his fight with Jack Dempsey, Firpo remains an iconic cultural figure in his homeland of Argentina. As wild as he may have looked in the ring, outside of the ropes he was a very shrewd businessman. Throughout his boxing career, he managed himself and did a very good job of it. He made the decisions on whom he would fight as well as negotiating the terms of the contracts.

When his fighting days were over, he became a car dealer for Stutz. He also went into ranching. Through his wise business dealings, he became a multimillionaire.

His career consisted of just 36 bouts of which he lost 4, plus

> two newspaper decisions that were said to go against him. Of his 36 wins, 26 were by knockout. He originally retired in 1926, but in 1936, he

fights before being stopped by Arturo Godoy. By all accounts, he got out of

the fight game with his faculties intact.

### HOOPS and HOCKEY in the HUB

A SARTORIAL CENTENNIAL SEASON - They were unveiled during a fashion show and they are bound to make a statement during the upcoming centennial season of the Boston Bruins.

They are the three new centennial jerseys that will be worn by players during the year — one for home games, another for road contests, and a third alternate one that will be worn against teams that comprise the Original Six group in the National Hockey League.

The jerseys - sometimes still called sweaters by longtime hockey fans - were unveiled recently during the centennial takeoff fashion show event at Logan Airport.

"In reaching such a monumental milestone — our 100th year - we really wanted to do something special with the sweater," stated Bruins President Cam Neely in a press release.

All three uniforms feature the famed spoked B crest in a style that is somewhat unique to this anniversary season. The crest has been a primary team identifier for 75 of the team's 100 years of existence but has varied in presentation somewhat over the years. The crest made its debut in 1948 when the B's observed their 25th anniversary.

The centennial crest features vintage spokes that recall the 1950s as well as the current varsity B design that has been a part of Bruins uniforms since 2007. The simple spokes of the centennial crest were worn by players during the Bobby Orr era as well as by later teams led by Ray Bourque and Cam Neely. More recently, the current serif B was worn by Zdeno Chara and Patrice Bergeron during three trips to the Stanley Cup Final.

The centennial home jersey is basically black while featuring gold and white striping. There is a patch that reads Bruins 1924-2024 with the numerals 100 emblazoned on the image of a bear. A small NHL patch is centered at the top. Those details might be hard to see by fans in the stands. The crest is prominently displayed and can easily be seen by all.

In contrast, the road jersey is basically white - which makes the black and gold striping vividly stand out. There is a small NHL patch centered at the top of the jersey, the centennial patch is on the right shoulder with the crest — a B with yellow spokes radiating from it — really making a statement.

The alternate jersey incorporates all the various elements mentioned above. It also is white but has gold shoulders with black cuffs on the lower arms and the gold, white, and black striping around the elbow plus a prominent black stripe across the upper chest. The centennial patch is on the right shoulder. The crest includes a black B with black spokes within an outlining black circle. The year 1924 in prominently on display within the crest.


The alternate jersey is the one we like the best, If the B's had chosen to go with just one jersey during the centennial year, the alternate jersey would have made an excellent choice. Unfortunately, it will be the jersey on display the least since it will be confined to those games in which the B's play an Original Six opponent - Montreal, Toronto, Detroit, Chicago, and the New York Rangers

One of the photos online features a close-up of the inside collar of one of the jerseys. It highlights the various years that Boston won the Stanley Cup – 1929, 1939, 1941, 1970, 1972, and 2011.

But it also has something else: a statement - "made in Indonesia." We feel that it is unfortunate that the Bruins, in conjunction with the NHL, could not have found a way to have these items manufactured somewhere in North America - either in the USA or Canada. Think what a very nice touch could have been achieved if the inside collar carried the statement "Proudly made in the USA."

Fans wishing to purchase the centennial jerseys can find them at the Garden Pro Shop or online. Be aware, they are inexpensive. According to the Garden pro shop's website, they vary in price from \$205 to \$260 apiece for men, meaning a set of all three will cost from over \$600 to more than \$700. Jerseys for women are priced at \$175 apiece and those for youngsters go from \$95 to \$125 each.

Such purchases are individual decisions and we leave it to fans to make that assessment for themselves. We would suggest that fans considering a purchase go to the Garden Pro Shop so they can make that decision while viewing the actual jerseys in person. MARCHAND MOVES TO THE TOP — On the day that the Bruins opened training camp (September 20th), it was announced that veteran Brad Marchand has been named captain of the team for the coming centennial season. "I am extremely proud of Brad and the player he has become," stated Bruins Chief Executive Officer Charlie Jacobs in a press release. "Brad has been a Bruin for 15 years and has had the opportunity to learn from great leaders in Zdeno Chara and Patrice Bergeron. He is ready for this opportunity. Our whole team will learn from his competitive nature and tenacity. I am confident that he will represent our organization with heart and grit." Marchand is the 27th captain in the history of the franchise that dates back to 1924. He follows in the footsteps of Bergeron who served in that capacity from 2021 until his retirement this summer. Chara served as captain from 2006 to 2020.

Entering the regular season, which starts next month, Marchand ranks eighth in team history.

In games played (947), fourth in game-winning goals (71), six in goals scored (372), ninth in assists (490) and seventh in points (862). He also ranks fifth in team playoff history in games played (146), second in playoff goals (53), fourth in playoff assists (75) and second in playoff points (128).

The Bruins open their centennial season against Chicago in the Garden on October 11th.
