Students Walk Out in Loudoun County

Hundreds of students in Loudoun County, VA walked out of classes on October 26th to protest their school district's handling of reported on-campus sexual assaults, The demonstration took place after a "gender-fluid" 15-year-old was found guilty in court the previous day of a May 28th attack on a teenage girl inside a bathroom at Stone Bridge High School. After this attack, the suspect was transferred to another high school and was accused of a sexual assault against another girl earlier in October.

Outside the Broad Run School on October 26th, a group of students chanted, "Loudoun County protects rapists." Organizers said the protest was intended to "show solidarity to victims of sexual violence and demand safety in our schools."

Parents Sue their School Board

Parents in Loudoun County, VA aren't the only school parents taking on their school board, now parents from Massachusetts in the town of Wellesley are also angry over "woke policies" they say violate their children's rights, such as "healing spaces," that exclude white students, and "the school district's handling of so-called bias incidents" so as to "penalize and chill speech." The suit is against the Biden Administration of Education's Office for Civil Rights.

Boston Boards The Wu Train

Finally, Boston's historic mayoral election has come and City Councilor Michelle Wu won by more than two dozen point victory over City Councilor Annissa Essaibi George and will be taking office in less than two weeks. Many political observers believe that Boston will now be a proving ground for progressive politics.

On Election night, Wu told her supporters, "We don't have to choose between generational change and keeping the streetlights on, between tackling big problems and bold solutions and filling potholes."

Essaibi-George put up a good fight but the numbers just weren't there for her. Many in East Boston were surprised that Wu won East Boston handily over Essaibi-George who is well liked in that community after her many years of being a teacher at East Boston High School.

If this year's mayoral results prove anything, it is that

AS FAR AS THE CITY COUNCIL AT-LARGE RACE GOES

The top vote getters were Michael Flaherty and Julia Mejas both running for reelection as At-Large Councilors. Flaherty solidified his title as dean of the Boston City Council. Mejas is now a very strong citywide candidate, which shows

her rapid popularity considering two years ago. In her first race in 2019, she won fourth place by only two votes over fifth place finisher.

This year's third place finisher was first time candidate Ruthzee Louijeune and in fourth place was Erin Murphy who finished in 6th place two years ago.

The non-binding question on returning to an elected school committee won approval across the city's neighborhoods. I supported a return to electing Boston's School Committee members. Appointed board members are just as political as the previous elected boards were. I would rather the people of Boston; especially schoolage parents choose who are their voices in decision-making rather than just the mayor, any

However, once again the voter turnout was a disgrace. Self -voter suppression is the worst kind of voter suppression.

MORE ROMAN TEMPLES

The Temple of Saturn, built about 284 A.D., faced the Forum Magnum Romantum and was one of the oldest of the sanctuaries. Saturn was the Roman god of Agriculture, and at one time was believed to be a mythical king of very early Rome who ruled graciously and brought civilization and morality to this area. A great festival was celebrated in December of each year and it was called the Saturnalia. It started as a one-day harvest festival that later grew to six or seven days. It was a period of joy and good will. Many banquets were held and people visited friends and exchanged gifts. Family slaves were usually given a few days of freedom, seated in places of honor at the family table, and served fine meals by their masters. Historians suggest this holiday as influencing the merrymaking surrounding the celebration of the modern Christmas season. The Saturnalia is also said to be the origin of today's carnival, or the Italian carnevale.

In a completely opposite vein, it might be interesting to note that in 1497, at the age of twenty-two, Michelangelo completed his statue of Bacchus, the Roman god of wine. The Greek counterpart to Bacchus was Dionysus and feasts consecrated to Bacchus were called Bacchanalia, Dionysia, or sometimes Orgia. They were originally nature festivals held in the Spring; later they became occasions for intoxication and licentiousness, tearing apart wild animals, eating raw flesh and savage dancing. The triennial Bacchanalia or Dionysia of Rome served also as an excuse for immorality, and were finally prohibited by the Senate in 168 B.C.

The Pantheon was started in 27 B.C. and was completed in 14 A.D. It is the most perfectly preserved of all the ancient buildings in Rome. It was named Pantheon of Deities (Gallery of the Gods) because the dome resembles the curved canopy of heaven. Built during the time of Agrippa and permitted to decay under Titus, it was rebuilt by Hadrian. Its use as a Christian church since 609 A.D. preserved it as a link between the life of the ancient and modern Rome.

The internal diameter of the dome and its height both equal one hundred forty-two and one-half feet and required walls twenty feet thick in order to counter the dome's tremendous thrust. For those interested in statistics, the diameter of the dome is thirty-five feet greater than the Church of San Sophia in Istanbul, thirty feet greater than St. Paul's in London, five feet greater than St. Peter's in Rome, and four feet greater than the Cathedral in Florence. The only light entering the Pantheon is from a twenty-seven foot diameter circular opening in the center of the dome. A hole in the floor drains off any rain that falls through the opening.

The ancient bronze entrance doors were originally plated with gold, the lower portion of the structure was faced with white pentelic marble, and the dome was covered with bronze plates. As mentioned above, this great temple is now a Christian church and is informally called Santa Maria Rotunda.



China Places Bans on Video Games

China reportedly will ban video games that don't promote "correct values" and "accurate understanding" of the country's history and culture, a leaked

The Wall Street Journal in internal document recently showed. It included a ban on any portrayal of "effeminate males," the promotion of same sex relationships, and the showing of characters who have no "clear gender."

The leaked document comes from a recent training session organized by China's state-backed gaming association. Beijing states that video plots shouldn't "have blurred moral boundaries," and players

L'Anno Bello: A Year in Italian Folklore

November, A Month of Reflection and Joy

I first noticed the commercials a few days before Halloween. Ads for layaway deals in bigbox stores began to pepper my television viewing experiences, replete with images of smiling Santa's, rolling ornaments and the sound of chattering jingle bells. Whenever one of these commercials caught my eye, a familiar, tingling sense of anticipation crept over me as I thought of the pleasures of the holiday season: swirling snowflakes, cookies baking in the oven, Christmas carols on the radio, potato latkes on sale for Hanukkah, trees illuminated with dozens of twinkling lights. However, I soon brought myself back to reality. I looked outside at the last yellow leaves drifting down from bare branches, the cornstalks and pumpkins decorating neighborhood homes. Halloween may be over, but we still have the whole month of November to enjoy! It is very tempting to dive into the pleasures of the holiday season early on, but the pulsating rhythms of the seasons and their unique feast days are meant to be experienced slowly, spiced with the trifecta of time, nature and mindfulness. This desire to live the seasons to their fullest proves especially palpable in November. Rather than a mere segue to the frenzied month of December, November boasts its own fascinating customs and traditions. As a month which signaled the end of the harvest and ushered in the beginning of winter, Italians honor the many faces of November, and their insights can help us appreciate this time for its singular

At times, November can appear to be a somber month, sober and silent. Its skies are thick black branches. Dead leaves collect in clumps across the wet

ground. Night wraps its dark cloak around the Earth early in the evening, uninterrupted by the colorful holiday lights that start to appear much later in the month. Winter feels imminent as the first bewildered snowflakes spiral down from the slate-colored sky. This is the month when nature settles into a nap, slumbering until its rebirth in the spring. Old Italian proverbs, hailing from the days of a primarily agricultural society, speak of the month's chilly, bleak characteristics. A dictum stating "Per Ognissanti, mantello e guante" reminds Italians to start putting on their coats and gloves on All Saints' Day, or November 1st. Another maxim, "Per Santa Caterina, la neve si avvicina," warns that snow looms close around the time of November 25th, the feast day of St. Catherine. Some may find this transitional state of November, caught between the harvest of the autumn and the desolation of winter, downright dreary. However, I believe it perfectly fits the nature of the month. November was the month of Samhain for the ancient Celts, a month to honor the dead. It is befitting that the weather should match ponderous ruminations on mortality and life. I find November the perfect time to devote myself to solitude and tranquility, to recharge my energy before the hectic holiday season.

However, November also contains another side, one of warmth, family and festivity. In Italy, November marked the end of the harvest. To celebrate this occasion, villages across the country held communal feasts in order to enjoy the results of Earth's bounty. Oftentimes, these feasts became attached gray blankets outlined by bare, to particular saints' days. St. Martin's Day, or San Martino in Italian, occurs on November 11th

and features banquets of goose, chestnuts, and the year's new wine. In fact, these foods feature in a notable Italian St. Martin's Day proverb: "Oca, castagne e vino per festeggiare San Martino!" Another feast, St. Andrew's Day, or Sant'Andrea, on November 30th, traditionally contained feasts of pork, commemorated in an Italian aphorism which states: "Da Sant'Andrea del maiale venticinque giorni a Natale." This proverb not only reminds Italians of the customary pork dishes on St. Andrew's Day, but also speaks of the fact that Christmas is twenty-five days away! Here in the United States, Thanksgiving beckons us into the comforts of family and friends, of heartwarming reunions and copious food to share. The stores brimming with boughs of holly and jolly elves tease the goodwill and joy of the upcoming holiday season. Though November demonstrates that nature goes through periods when it is devoid of regrowth and resting, the love of good company and the generosity of the Earth help us overcome that.

Italians honor November with communal feasts and unique holidays. Yes, the temperatures may drop to a biting cold, and the first dustings of snow may glitter on the ground. However, November also brims with a plethora of traditions that enforce the warmth of family gatherings in the face of the approaching winter, from the sampling of new wine of St. Martin's Day to preparations for Christmas occurring at the end of the month. Since time immemorial, Italians knew that the best way to contend with the solemn, wintry tone of November was to revel in its unique characteristics, but also introduce joyous festivities to keep people full of hope and optimism. As the month progresses, we may become worried about a frigidly cold winter filled with heavy coats and thick scarves. However, during such moments of dreariness, we should remember that the bleak November weather offers a much-needed chance for relaxation and reflection, and that the light and gaiety of the holidays will soon be upon us!

It might be hard to believe that 60 years has passed since a well known young actor -Hayley Mills, began her iconic career with two well received British Films but was also contracted to star in a series of Disney movies, which was largely responsible for making Mills an international star.

For those interested in the film interested, this is the book for you; indeed, Mills not only pens her autobiography relative to her career but gives the reader a substantial background on the entertainment industry itself. And, if you are a reader whose interest might be only in the author's background as the daughter of English actor Sir John Mills and Mary Hayley (Lady) Mills, an author in her own right, then this too is the narrative for you.

Hayley Mills ... is a comprehensive work ranging back to the late 1950s and early '60s with Mills' staring opposite Horst Buchholz in Tiger Bay and then with Alan Bates in Whistle Down the Wind (written by Mills mother Mary.) 





Saint Maria Soledad

Maria was born and baptized with the name Bibiana Antonia Acosta, in Madrid, Spain, on December 2, 1826. Her parents were Francis Torres and Antonia Acosta, a pious couple running a small business in Madrid. Maria, the second of five children was educated by the Daughters of Charity, and as a child often visited the sick in her neighborhood and performed small penances for the benefit of others.

Because of her poor health, she was unsuccessful in entering the Dominican community, as she desired to become a nun. In 1851, Fr Michael Martinez, a

parish Priest and member of the Third Order of the Servites, asked her to minister to the sick and poor of his parish, in their homes. She accepted and with six companions, began this ministry taking the name Maria Soledad.

Martinez in 1856 took with him six of the twelve religious to the missions at Fernando Pó, which left Maria as the superior of the order and the sole remaining member of the original group.

Maria was appointed as their Superior and the Sisters that remained with Maria immediately removed her from this office. The move so disorganized the community that the Bishop threatened to dissolve it. The Bishop held an investigation and re-appointed Maria as Superior, with the help of the new Director, Fr Gabino Sanchez, an Augustinian. It was at this time, that the community took the name of "Handmaids of Mary Serving the Sick". The Bishop formally approved their ministry and extended their work to care for the delinquents of Madrid. Their order received much publicity for their care of the sick when the cholera epidemic broke out.

Maria faced several trials throughout her time of leadership in the congregation. The Handmaids grew in number and in 1875, began a ministry in Havana, Cuba. The new institute received Papal approval in 1876. Maria governed the community for 35 years.

Maria Soledad was working in Havana, Cuba when she contracted pneumonia. She passed away on October 11, 1887. At the time of her death, there were 46 Houses in Europe and Latin America. She was buried in the Sisters cemetery at the Motherhouse in Madrid, Spain and in 1893, her body was exhumed and transferred to the Chapel. Her body was intact, exuding a sweet odor. She was Canonized by St Pope Paul VI on January 25, 1970. The Feast day of Saint Maria Soledad is October 11th.

Since its beginnings in Jamaica in 1959, the story of the pioneering Island Records label has been inextricably linked to the story of its founder, Chris Blackwell. Now, Blackwell has curated a series of compilation LPs featuring his handpicked tracks that correspond with his and Island's legendary history. This third volume of *The Vinyl Series*, is an 18-track double LP compiling some of

the label's key releases of the late 1960s and early '70s. The counterculture, which came to full force in 1967, had coincided with Island's launch as a label. This volume of The Vinyl Series includes material rooted in the folk and acousticbased styles that were crucial to Island's foundation. Nick Drake's "Way to Blue" from his first album. Five Leaves Left and "Late November" by Sandy Denny, represents that side of the label's history. Cat Stevens was identified most commonly with Island in the U.K., and he continued to be Island's biggest seller, this album contains his 1971 global smash "Morning Has Broken." Island had also broken through into enormous success on the harder rock front. Free hit big with the 1970 album Fire and Water, whose title track opens the Volume Three collection. When Paul Rodgers and Simon Kirke split with Free to form Bad Company, they stayed with Island and became a worldwide sensation. Progressive-rock super group Emerson Lake and Palmer, represented here with their biggest hit single, 1970s "Lucky Man." Island's rock roster reached into the world of glam in the early '70s. Along with Roxy's magnificent first single, "Virginia Plain," and lead singer Bryan Ferry's solo cover of "The In Crowd," Volume Three also includes Traffic's "Dear Mr. Fantasy," and "Better By You, Better Than Me," by Spooky Tooth, as well as "This Town Ain't Big Enough for Both of Us," by the enigmatic duo Sparks. Blackwell and Island Records will forever be associated with the music of Jamaica, and the period addressed in this album includes two landmark events that changed the world. He had released Bob Marley's first solo single in the UK in 1962, he met and signed the Wailers a decade later, setting in motion one of the greatest careers music has ever seen. Concurrently, Island released the soundtrack for the revolutionary 1972 film The Harder They Come, which introduced reggae to an international audience. This collection includes two classics from that film — "Johnny Too Bad" by the Slickers and Jimmy Cliff the star of the movie, singing "You Can Get It If You Really Want." The majestic Toots and the Maytals. heard on this set performing 1974s "Time Tough," were also part of the soundtrack, which helped launch them to global prominence. "This Is Reggae Music," a declarative single by the Jamaican band Zap Pow released in the wake of the soundtrack's success, is also included. Nanna & Babbononno

A Nostalgic Remembrance



Dad was a survivor of the great depression of the 20th century. Seeing he was a musician, and his instrument was a full size bass violin, he needed a car to carry his "bull fiddle from job to job. An automobile, to my father was a means of transportation, nothing more. This meant he bought used two or four sedans that were categorized as the low priced three ... Chevy, Ford, or Plymouth ... cars that could carry his bass violin and were inexpensive and economical.

When he met my mother in the early '30s, he owned a Ford Model A. He kept it until I was born in '38, and then bought a year-old '37 Plymouth from a mailman friend. He kept this car until 1949 when the car was on its last leg. He sold it to a young man who intended to enter it in a demolition derby. With me by his side when I was 11, we headed to Reese Chevrolet in Day Square of East Boston, and for the first time in his life, Dad bought a new car, a 1949 Chevy Super Deluxe. When he told Grandpa Christoforo and Babbononno what he paid, \$1,200, they both told him he was crazy spending that kind of money for something that was going to immediately depreciate in value.

Neither of my grandfathers ever drove. Grandpa was functionally illiterate in both Italian and English. Babbononno was born before the advent of automobiles and he would fear most everything about cars for his entire life. Both of my grandfathers preferred to use the ferries that crossed from East Boston to Boston Proper because the passenger fee was one cent. When the ferries went out of business, they used the subway, then called the Boston Elevated, to get to and from work.

Nanna never drove, nor did my mother. The first woman in my family to drive a car was Aunt Ninna, Uncle Gino's wife. When I was about 12, Mom asked Dad to teach her how to drive. We were at a fair ground in upstate New York the summer of 1950 and Dad drove to a large paved vacant lot, explained the operations to my mother and put here behind the steering wheel of his blessed himself. I was sitting in in love with a '60 Cadillac conthe back seat with Dad's business partner as my dear mother attempted to drive. Within a minute or two, Mom stalled the car, and Dad's partner opened the door, jumped out and made the sign of the cross, too. I thought this was strange seeing the man was of the Jewish faith, but I never said anything.

I, on the other hand, have always had a love affair with automobiles. Even when I was a kid, I loved the looks of the cars of the '30s and '40s. My favorites back in the day were Packard and Cadillac. I made wooden models of the cars I liked, put a portfolio together with some original auto designs, and submitted them to General Motors. Each year, they sponsored a design contest, and by the mid '50s, I received honorable mention from GM, and was offered a slot as a freshman at General Motors Institute in Flint, Michigan. I wanted to design automobiles for a living, but it never happened. Dad really couldn't afford to send me to a college out of state and Mom's attitude was that I should live at home until I was married. It was an Italian thing ... and we were definitely

During my teen years, most of my street corner friends bought their own cars. Many quit school and went to work. Most bought used Ford coupes and convertibles, except one adventuresome friend. He bought a 1940 La Salle convertible and painted it to look like the Batmobile. The friends who stayed in school borrowed their family cars once or twice a week and we went joy riding. After I got my license at age 16, I seldom could use Dad's car. He, being a musician, drove to work almost every night. If Dad was playing in down town Boston and I had a date, I would drive him to work and drop my date off in time to pick up Dad. Back then, most of Dad's jobs ended by midnight and the time frame was inconvenient when

When I became a musician in my late teens, like my father, I played bass violin and needed my own transportation. My first car was a '54 Chevy that I bought in 1958. It had been done over and served me well. The only problem was that it wasn't undercoated and rusted away. Once I graduated from college in 1960, I could afford something better and found a '58 Thunderbird. It was the first year T-Bird had a rear seat, and with the extra space, my bass fit inside without a problem. I kept year-old '49 Chevy, and then the car for 2 years and then fell vertible, which I purchased used in the early '60s.

> My next car was a '64 Chrysler Imperial convertible. This model of Chrysler was as close to a Rolls Royce as an American car had come since the 1930s. After the Imperial, I went back to Cadillac and stayed with that make for many years. By then,

I was teaching in the Boston Schools during the day and playing music at night, so money wasn't a problem. What I didn't mention was I have never bought a new car. All the cars that followed the '54 Chevy were classified as luxury cars, but buying them at 2, 3, or 4 years old, they were a lot cheaper and most had low miles on the odometer. Also, I was pretty much guaranteed that some kid hadn't been hotrodding his father's luxury car through the streets of Boston. I was right and had great luck with most all of my future cars.

Years later, I was coaching Little League baseball, as both my boys, John and Michael, were playing the sport and I wanted to be involved. After a Friday win, I brought my team to a Brigham's for ice cream and a car show was being held in their parking lot. I fell in love with an antique Thunderbird. The owner told me that he had another at home and it was for sale. The following week, I looked at the car. It needed everything, but I wanted to get involved in the hobby, bought it and restored it. Today my '66 Thunderbird is in show room condition and is parked at my house in Florida.

I recently sold my second antique car to a collector in Texas, a 1962 Lincoln Continental. It was in good shape when I found it and after I worked on it a bit, it too looked like it was just out of the showroom of a Lincoln dealer. I also have a 73 Mercedes Benz 450sl convertible, a 2 seater with a big V8 engine. In the warm weather, I drive this around town with the top down and the engine roaring away. My everyday car is a 2006 Cadillac DTS. They don't make them that big any more but loving big cars, I keep it in perfect shape.

When people ask why I spend the money and the time on cars, I answer them with, "I don't drink, I don't smoke cigarettes, I don't take drugs, I don't chase stray women ... so I need something. I'm getting too old to play with boats or fly a plane, two former hobbies I had. So, I keep myself busy playing with cars. If Babbononno were alive he would say, "Giovanni, tu se pazzo." (John, you're crazy.) Oh



In Northern Italy apple orchards are in abundance throughout the Veneto, Friuli and Trentino-Alto Adige regions. The apples grown in this area are found in a variety of ways, from local desserts and cakes to appetizing second courses! Just to name a few, there's the classic Northern Italian Apple Strudel, Strudel di Mele; Apple Cake, Torta di Mele; and even Italy's version of Apple Pie, the Crostata di Mele. In savory dishes, these apples are most often found paired with pork.

When I was growing up, my Nonna had a huge apple tree in her backyard. She and I would often take the ripened apples from this tree and make a wealth of incredible desserts from them. We made various cakes and crostata's, and one was always more delicious than the next. At this time of year, when bushels of fresh picked apples are almost everywhere, it's the perfect time to make a scrumptious dessert with them. The recipe I am sharing, Apple Tart Squares or Torta di Mele Quadrati, was given to my Nonna many years ago and it makes an amazing dessert. It is loved by children and adults alike and is perfect to serve for the upcoming holiday. Pair it with a scoop of vanilla bean gelato, and you and your guests will be delighted!

APPLE TART SQUARES Torta di Mele Quadrati



1 cup butter, softened 3/4 cup granulated sugar 1/4 cup and 3 tablespoons brown sugar

Filling

7 to 8 large apples (I use Cortland), peeled, sliced, and cut into bite sized chunks Juice from ½ fresh lemon ½ cup sugar

3 teaspoons pure vanilla 4 cups all-purpose flour ½ cup rolled oats (or oldfashioned Quaker Oats) 1 teaspoon cinnamon

½ teaspoon cinnamon Pinch of nutmeg Pinch of allspice 4 tablespoons butter, melted and cooled

2 tablespoons all-purpose flour

Preheat oven to 350. Grease and flour a 9 x 13 baking pan, set aside.

To make the crust, add the sugars and butter into a large mixing bowl. Cream these ingredients together well, then add the vanilla and continue beating. Gradually cut in the flour, oats, and spices, and mix until combined. Mixture will be crumbly and should yield about 9 cups. Take 3 cups of this mixture and set it aside to use for the top of the squares. Use the remaining 6 cups and press this into the prepared baking pan, evenly covering the bottom, and about 3/4 inch up on the sides. Place the pan in the oven, bake for 10 minutes and immediately remove.

To make the filling, place the apples in a medium mixing bowl and coat evenly with lemon juice. In a small bowl, whisk together the sugar, flour and spices and add this to the apples, mix well. Add the melted butter and be sure the apples are coated evenly. Spread this mixture evenly on the baked crust. With the remaining crust, evenly distribute small pieces (this is not a crumb topping) you have squeezed in your hand over the top. Bake for 50 to 60 minutes or until the apples have softened and the top is a light golden brown. Cool and refrigerate for several hours before cutting to serve.

Operation Entebbe: A Rescue Story

The hijacking of Air France Flight 139 by two members of the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine on June 27, 1976 was one of the first modern terrorism attacks, now using airlines as a weapon, but it is remembered primarily for the successful rescue of hostages; a mission led by Israel Defense Forces that has become an exemplary display of military brilliance.

The flight left Tel Aviv carrying 246 passengers and 12 crewmembers. The plane then had a layover in Athens where 58 additional passengers boarded, among them four terrorists. At 12:30 p.m., the flight took off for its final destination of Paris.

Soon after take-off, however, the four hijackers (two members of the Popular Front for the Liberation of Palestine and two members of West Germany's Revolutionary Cells Wilfried Böse and Brigitte Kuhlmann) took control of the aircraft and diverted it to Benghazi. While the plane refueled in Libya one passenger was released by the terrorists, Patricia Martell, an Israeli-born Briton who faked a miscarriage to convince the abductors to release her.

At 3:15 p.m. the following day, the plane arrived at Uganda's Entebbe airport. Here four other hijackers joined the group with the aid of Ugandan President Idi Amin who had pledged support to the hijackers, though he often visited the hostages and promised to do all in his power to facilitate a smooth release once the demands of the hijackers were met. The demands were \$5 million U.S. dollars and the release of 53 Palestinian prisoners, 40 of which were being held in Israel. The terrorists threatened to begin killing the hostages in two days if the demands were not met.

The following day, the hostages were divided into two groups. The captors read the name of Israeli passengers and ordered them into a separate room of the airport terminal. The following day, perhaps motivated by an unwillingness to bring on an early onslaught by Israeli forces before their demands could be met, the captors released 48 hostages from the non-Israeli group (mostly the elderly and children with their parents) and flew them to Paris by arrangement.

If the motivation was to demonstrate a willingness to compromise it seemed to work as Israel communicated immediately following the hostage release a consideration of fulfilling demands. In turn. The captors not only extended the deadline to July 4^{th} but released an additional 100 non-Israeli hostages who were also flown to Paris.

The delay allowed Israel to plan a rescue mission (after attempted pleas to Idi Amin were met with deaf ears). The released hostages offered much valuable information about the whereabouts of hostages and numbers of the opposition, facts that helped Israel determine the best possible strategy.

The biggest logistical problem for Israeli Defense Forces was the refueling of its aircraft enroute to Entebbe, a feat not possible without a layover in another East African country. Kenyan Minister of Agriculture Bruce MacKenzie successfully talked Kenyan president Jomo Kenyatta into allowing Israeli force to use Nairobi Airport (now Jomo Kenyatta Airport) for refueling. With this secure Operation Entebbe was underway consisting of a team of 100 Israeli Defense Forces.

Flying an unorthodox route to avoid detection by Sudanese and Saudi Arabian forces, the Israeli combat team landed in Entebbe on July 3rd. Using a black Mercedes typical of the sort Amin used when arriving at the airport and several Land Rovers. Two of the Ugandan military personnel, suspecting that the cars were not carrying Ugandan government officials (Amin had as of lately been using a white Mercedes), ordered them to halt. One of the soldiers began firing at the vehicle, to which Israeli forces responded with return of fire and a dash for the terminal as there was a fear among the rescue team that their cover had been blown.

Abandoning the vehicles and rushing toward the terminal, the Israeli soldiers shouted through a megaphone to stay down and identified themselves as Israeli soldiers.

The raid was quick, efficient and, all things considered, a miraculous success. Once gathering information from the hostages about the captor's whereabouts, Israeli forces threw grenades into the room in which they were hiding and finished off the remaining terrorists with AK47s. Three of the hostages were killed (two by friendly fire). The remaining 102 were put on the Israeli plane and shipped to Paris.

Only one surviving hostage, 74-year-old Dora Bloch, was left behind in Uganda and sent to a hospital.

As the hostages boarded the rescue plane, Ugandan forces fired at them from the control tower, killing Israeli unit commander Yonatan Netanyahu. Israel annihilated the Ugandan forces by firing a rocket-propelled grenade at the tower and destroying the grounded Ugandan aircraft on the runway. The passengers were boarded onto the plane and flown safely to Paris with a previously arranged layover in Nairobi.

Idi Amin was enraged and vowed revenge for the raid. His forces arrested 14 Ugandan soldiers on suspicion of having aided Israel and executed 12 of them. On Amin's orders, two Ugandan Army Officers entered Mulago Hospital in Kampala where Dora Bloch was being treated, murdered her doctors and nurses for trying to protect her room, then proceeded to drag Bloch out of her bed, shot her dead and dumped her body in a nearby sugar plantation. Amin then directed his anger toward Kenyans for their help to Israel and ordered his forces to massacre 245 Kenyans living in Uganda. This saw an exodus of nearly 3,000 Kenyans fleeing the country. Almost two years later, Kenyan Minister of Agriculture, Bruce MacKenzie was killed by a bomb attached to the aircraft that was flying him back home after a meeting with Idi Amin, the reason for his murder is still disputed but his aid to Israel remains a suspected factor.

Operation Entebbe was one of the most successful heroic rescue missions of our time. It is a testament to the collaboration between nations, careful military planning and a little bit of faith.







HOOPS and HOCKEY in the HUB

SAVORING SAVORY'S SENSATIONAL STARTS — That's what fans of the University of Massachusetts-Lowell men's hockey team were doing in the aftermath of netminder Owen Savory's outstanding performances over the final weekend of October. The senior from Ontario was the backstopper in a sweep of Boston University as the River Hawks opened the Hockey East portion of their schedule.

And what a way to open it with a 3-0 shutout as he made 29 saves in a 3-0 blanking of the Terriers. It was the seventh shutout

Then the next night, he allowed only a single tally as UML posted a 2-1 triumph before its hometown fans at Tsongas Arena.

For the weekend Savory finished with 48 total saves, earning Hockey East Goalie of the Week honors while vaulting the River Hawks into the national rankings as the number 19 team in the country. Individually, he owned a 1.23 goals against average (the tops in Hockey East) to go with a .946 save percentage — the sixth best in college hockey across America.

Certainly a pair of glittering performances — rather than a sequence of horror shows — over Halloween Weekend.

A RESPECTABLE RETURN — They were Crimson jerseys that people saw, both on ESPN+ and in person, as Harvard journeyed to Hanover, New Hampshire to take on Dartmouth in the season opener over the last weekend of October.

What made the occasion special was the fact that it had been a total of 601 days since fans had last seen the Crimson on the ice. When followers of Harvard hockey had last witnessed the team in action, it had earned a berth in the 2020 ECAC hockey playoff quarterfinals with a 7-1 victory over RPI in the second game of the opening round series against the Engineers. Then, on March 11, 2020, Harvard shut down due to COVID-19. Later, as the pandemic continued, the eight Ivy schools decided not to compete in all athletics during the 2020-2021 academic year.

It certainly was a strange sight on the local level last year as Northeastern, Boston College, and Boston University (among numerous others) all managed to play, although there were often postponements and delays. Even the ECAC, the league Harvard hockey competes in, managed a season, although with a reduced number of teams.

Be that as it may, Harvard was back on the ice as October took its leave — but with a vastly different team that included 14 new players, including eight freshmen and six sophomores, on the roster. Veteran Crimson Coach Ted Donato, a former Bruin and Harvard graduate, is now in his 18th season behind the bench at his alma mater. He entered the new season with a 253-221-61 career coaching record in Cambridge.

Donato was a member of the Harvard team that won the 1989 Frozen Four National Championship, with the Dedham native scoring two goals in the title game that saw the Crimson defeat Minnesota 4-3 in overtime. He also competed in the 1992 Winter Olympics as a member of Team USA and played in the NHL for 13 seasons. His son Ryan, who also played at Harvard, is now with the NHL's newest team, the Seattle Kraken.

The Crimson didn't disappoint Coach Donato in their highly anticipated return to action, coming away with a convincing 9-3 triumph over Dartmouth. The next night, back home in Cambridge after their extended absence, Harvard also scored a 7-3 win over Bentley, thus completing their opening weekend without a setback.

PLAYERS ON THE "A" LIST — You've got to hand it to the folks who handle the numbers at NHL headquarters. They sure keep coming up with interesting statistics. One of their latest lists was comprised of Bruins players who debuted with the team and the number of games it took each to reach 400 assists. The all-time leader is Bobby Orr, who reached the 400-assist level during the 1972-1973 season while playing in his 437th career game.

Next is Ray Bourque, who reached 400 in career game 544 during 1986-1987. Third on the list is Wayne Cashman, who notched his 400th in the 1978-79 campaign.

David Krejci, now playing overseas, reached 400 in his 774th career game during 2018-2019.

Brad Marchand, in fifth place, is the most recent, getting to 400 in the B's victory over Florida on October 30th during his 811th game with the franchise.

STILL ON STATS — Alex Ovechkin has had three years where he has opened the season with an eight-game point streak. But former Bruin Dennis Wideman, who played on Causeway Street from 2006 through 2010, is one of three players with a season opening point streak of seven games. He accomplished the feat at the start of the 2011-2012 season while playing for the Washington Capitals.

Vic Stasiuk, who played for the Bruins in the 1950s and early 1960s, is one of six players to score both a game-tying goal and the go-ahead goal in the final two minutes of an NHL matchup.

It happened on March 21, 1959, when the Bruins faced the Canadiens at the old Montreal Forum. Stasiuk had scored the opening goal of the game midway through the first period to give the B's a 1-0 lead, but Montreal had come back to take command at 3-2. Then, late in the third period, Stasiuk scored a pair of goals within a 39-second span to earn a hat trick and give the B's a 4-3 lead with just over a minute left. Indeed, his third tally of the day proved to be the game-winning goal.

Stasiuk, now 92, came to Boston via a trade with Detroit. A left wing, his regular linemates were Johnny Bucyk and Bronco Horvath.

He played six seasons with the Bruins from 1955-1956 through 1960-1961. He saw action in 745 regular season games with the B's, scoring 183 goals and amassing 254 assists for 437 points across 745 games played. He went 16-18-34 in 66 playoff games.

He later served as the head coach of the Philadelphia Flyers, the California Golden Seals, and the Vancouver Canucks.
