CDC Warns U.S. to Prepare for Coronavirus

The CDC is urging people to prepare for spread of the coronavirus, warning that it's likely to become more common in the U.S.

"Disruption to everyday life might be severe," said Nancy Messonnier, director of CDC's National Center for Immunization and Respiratory Diseases.

The U.S. currently has 57 cases, including 40 former passengers of the *Diamond Princess* cruise ship. As outbreaks pop up beyond China, the CDC says cases are likely to spread here, as well

"It's not so much of a question of if this will happen in this country anymore but a question of when this will happen," Messonnier said.

"We are asking the American public to prepare for the expectation that this might be bad."

Public health officials said that while it's not time to panic, it is time to prepare. Messonnier said that parents should ask their children's schools about

any plans to close. Businesses should consider whether they can offer alternate work options, such as telecommuting.

Her comments came as public health officials monitor the outbreaks in three areas: South Korea, Italy, and Iran.

In Italy, authorities are reporting a cluster of cases in Lombardy and other nearby regions. The outbreak there, which includes 229 cases and 6 deaths, are not linked to travel. Authorities took a number of steps to contain the outbreak, including travel bans to the affected areas and shutting down public events.

A spike of cases in Iran also occurred, not from travel, officials with the World Health Organization (WHO). The country has 61 cases of the disease and 12 deaths.

In the U.S., the number of Coronavirus cases jumped to 57 after more passengers from the Japanese cruise ship Diamond Princess tested positive. The

U.S. evacuated more than 300 passengers from the ship where nearly 700 cases and 3 deaths occurred among its passengers.

Worldwide the number of cases have surpassed 80,000, the majority of them in China, and the number of deaths is now 2,665, according to the European Center for Disease Prevention and Control. More than 2,300 are confirmed outside of China in more than two dozen countries. South Korea, Italy, and Japan are the countries with the most cases outside of China.

More than 1,700 health care workers in China have been diagnosed with the virus, and six have died, according to reports. Most of the cases were in Hubei, the province at the center of the outbreak.

These are the first federal quarantine orders issued in 50 years, the last coming in the 1960s for smallpox evaluations, CDC officials said.

Will Virginia Drop Electoral College?

The Wall Street Journal editorialized against a move by Virginia to drop the Electoral College on Tuesday, February 18th. Virginia has long been a presidential battleground state, but now the Democrat-controlled House of Delegates recently passed a bill to do an end run around the Electoral College, which could shed this state's importance as a swing state status.

Under the National Popular Vote Interstate Compact, Virginia would award its 13 delegates to the candidate who gets the most votes nationwide regardless of the state vote winner. The compact would go into effect once states worth 270 electoral votes a majority have signed on. If Virginia ratifies the compact that would bring the number to 209.

The remaining 61 would be a steep climb and getting them isn't entirely out of question. Good news, once the compact reaches 270, the lawsuits will start and the U.S. Supreme Court will hopefully stop its implementation before the compact throws us into electoral chaos. How can this liberal idea not be unconstitutional?

Virginia voters need to stand up against this. Every vote should count even those of every Virginian, too.

PROMETHEUS, EPIMETHEUS, AND PANDORA

Once again, we are reminded that all references to Zeus or Jupiter, supreme god of the heavens, are used synonymously in Roman and Greek mythology.

Prometheus and his brother Epimetheus were sons of the Titan Iapetus and they were also brothers to Atlas. Prometheus and Epimetheus were charged with the duty to create man and to provide him, and all other living things with the means necessary for their survival. Prometheus mixed some earth with water, made man, and then caused him to walk upright in the image of the gods.

As animals had already been created, Epimetheus undertook to provide them with various gifts, such as courage,

swiftness, claws, etc. When man, however, was to be provided for, there was nothing left to bestow upon him. Meanwhile the gods were negotiating with mankind, after their conquest of the Titans, regarding the honor to be paid to them. Prometheus was ordered to kill a bull and offer it in sacrifice to both gods and men. He divided the bull into two sections. One-half of the hide contained the flesh and inner organs after cleverly concealing them beneath the stomach. In the second half, he put the bones, but hid them beneath a layer of rich fat. Zeus was asked to choose one of the halves, with the understanding that the other half would be given to mankind. Zeus selected the portion displaying the fat, and after realizing that he had been tricked, flew into a violent rage. In his resentment, he resolved to destroy the human race by withholding fire from them and to create other beings in their place.

Prometheus alone was concerned with the fate of the poor mortals so he saved them from

destruction by going up to Olympus, stealing fire, and bringing it back to mankind in a hollow reed. This is the fire which was to become the source of all discoveries and the element which would permit man to be the master over nature.

When the act of Prometheus was discovered, it is said that the anger of Zeus knew no bounds. Prometheus was seized and chained to a rock or pillar on a mountain, where each day a monstrous eagle tore at his liver, which re-grew whole again each night. Finally, Hercules, on his journey to perform one of his celebrated labors, shot and killed the eagle and freed Prometheus from his bonds. The next time you visit the City of Philadelphia; don't

miss the masterpiece by the Flemish artist, Peter Paul Rubens, entitled "Prometheus Bound." It's in that city's museum of art.

Mankind was also punished for its participation when Zeus created a woman of great beauty and named her Pandora (the all-gifted). Every god had contributed something towards her perfection. She was brought down from the heavens, declared to be the first woman on earth, and presented to Epimetheus who took her as his wife against the advice of Prometheus.

The house of Epimetheus contained a jar in which was sealed all of the evils of mankind. Pandora's curiosity caused her to open the jar and the evils poured out. She hastily replaced the lid but only succeeded in preventing the escape of "hope." This episode of Pandora is interpreted to signify that whatever evils might surround us, we are never left without hope. "Speranza."

Saint Stanislaus Papczyński

Jan Papczyński was born on May 18, 1631, the son of Tomasz Papczyński and Zofia Tacikowska in the village of Podergrozie. He was the youngest of eight children. His father, Tomasz was a local blacksmith and also served as the village bailiff.

At the age of fifteen he entered the Jesuit College at Jaroslaw, the Piarist College of Podoliniec in 1649, and in 1650 the Jesuit College of Lvov, from which he was forced to flee due to an attack by Cossack troops. At the age of twenty-three

he completed his general and philosophy studies at the Jesuit College of Rawa Mazowiecka.

On July 2, 1654, Papczyński joined the Piarist Order, newly established in Poland, in their monastery in Podoliniec and was given the religious name of "Stanislaus of Jesus and Mary."

While still a seminarian, he taught rhetoric using a textbook that he wrote, The Messenger of the Queen of Arts, for which he received great praise. He helped work on the cause for the beatification of the Piarists' founder, Fr. Joseph Calasanz. Saint Joseph Calasanz founded the Piarists in Italy in 1579. The Piarists excelled at teaching, offering quality education to lower-class students. These schools became quite popular, expanding into Poland in 1642.

Father Stanislaus advocated for stricter adherence to their rule, gaining a reputation for being what his opponents called a "firebrand." Though he remained in the good graces of his superiors, several members kept accusing him of wrongdoing. Wishing to restore peace, Fr. Stanislaus requested to be released from the Piarists, a drawn out, complicated ordeal. But the Order eventually released him of his vows on Oct. 24,



Around this time, Fr. Papczynski felt the call to establish the Marian Fathers of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary nearly two centuries before the Immaculate Conception even became official Church dogma

Father Stanislaus assigned three goals to his new community: to promote devotion to the Immaculate Conception, to pray for the Holy Souls in Purgatory, and to minister to people lacking spiritual guidance.

He donned a white habit to symbolize the Blessed Mother's purity. During these initial years, Fr. Stanislaus received the gift of healing. He also authored his Norma Vitae

(The Rule of Life), which would later become the Constitution of the Marian Fathers.

He became the first Pole to found a religious community in Poland. He established a hermitage, which did not require apostolic approval. Otherwise, the Order would have undoubtedly been suppressed. Not wanting the future of the Marian Fathers to remain eremitical, he included a specific clause in his Rule that made pastoral work in parishes an essential part of the mission. Eventually, Fr. Stanislaus' holiness attracted many vocations to his monastery, and the Order expanded.

After many years of petitioning, the Marian Fathers received approval from the Holy Father Innocent XII

On Sept. 17, 1701, Fr. Stanislaus died in Gora Kalwaria, near Warsaw.

Pope Francis canonized him on June 6, 2016. He is the "Patron Saint of Those in Mortal Danger."

The Feast Day of Saint Stanislaus Papczynski Is September 17th.

North End Waterfront Health The Nazzaro Center should become a Senior Wellness Center

Thursday, February 20th students from the BAC presented some possible options for the Nazzaro Center use once a new Community Center is built. They met with many different organizations and stakeholders to develop possibilities based on recommendations they received. They reiterated that the plans they presented were meant to be used as a starting point for conversations on future use. We are thankful they put in the time and effort into helping the community see some possibilities.

I believe the Nazzaro Center should become a Senior Wellness Center for our growing senior population. In 2019, the health center served 2,334 seniors, a 40% increase from the number served in 2016. Most of this is due to patients aging up from younger years. Since there are three senior housing facilities and soon that will increase to four, the North End will always have a large senior population.

Today's seniors are not like our parents. Some say 70 is the new 50! Today's senior wants to stay healthy and vibrant. The health center would like to provide health promotion and disease prevention services that are not provided today due to space constraints in its current building. Examples include acupuncture, reflexology, therapeutic and recuperative therapies, specialized behavioral health, memory care, exercise and gym equipment specialized for seniors and nutrition counseling and education. Open space would be available for senior clubs and community meetings. It would not include drug rehab or methadone services. In meetings with the Mayor, he has told me that the City will continue to own the building and would like to see it be used for seniors. Of course funding is always an issue and I believe the building needs a gut renovation to bring it up to modern standards. That is a challenge we face but I believe is not unsurmountable.

Last week, Mayor Walsh was in East Boston celebrating the conversion of an old library into a new senior center. The community rallied around the idea and the City was ready to start the project. The Mayor should do the same in the North End. Our seniors deserve nothing less.

About the San Rocco Society: Established in 1921, by immigrants from Italy, the San Rocco Society is still run by the descendants of San Nicola Baronia. Ministering at Piacenza, he himself finally fell ill. He was expelled from the town; and withdrew into the forest, where he made himself a hut of boughs and leaves, which was miraculously supplied with water by a spring that arose in the place; he would have perished had not a dog belonging to a nobleman named Gothard Palastrelli supplied him with bread and licked his wounds, healing them. Count Gothard, following his hunting dog that carried the bread, discovered Saint Roch and became his acolyte.

The Italians even repeat a dictum which intones: "Marzo pazarello, guarda il sole e prendi l'ombrello." Translated, this means: "Crazy March, look at the sun and grab the umbrella." The proverb certainly rings true for my own memories of March. One day, I may be walking under a cloudy sky, propelled by a brisk breeze and practically swimming in misty rain. The next day, I can venture outside in a t-shirt and take heed of leaf buds peeking out in the sunshine. The unpredictable weather is part of March's unique charm, and it keeps us looking forward to spring.

2) **Spring Fever Abounds:** On March 8th, Daylight Savings

Time will begin, heralding longer days. I love the thrill of unexpected daytime, of walking outside at five o'clock and seeing dappled sunlight on the forest trees. It energizes me and makes me appreciative of the cycle of time. However, sundry other signs of spring appear in March. CHAPTER 16 Cooking School

The great thing about the 1940s was that moms were still housewives and at home for the kids. Mom was no exception. She was always there waiting for us, only she usually had her coat on, and was ready to take us somewhere as soon as we came through the door. One of her favorite places was cooking class at the North End Trade School.

The North End Trade School in the 1940s oriented itself to basic neighborhood needs that included a nursery, craft classes, summer camp and of course, cooking classes. The school was housed in an old three-story brick building. The cooking classes were held in a large kitchen on the main floor, where a dozen or more neighborhood women would gather twice a week to learn basic American cooking, but the classes seemed to be about anything but cooking.

Mom was a good cook and really didn't need lessons. In fact, most of the women who attended the classes were good cooks. Mom went to learn how to cook American style food, at least that's the explanation she gave Dad. She really went because she and her friends at the school enjoyed getting together, gossiping and just being out of the house for an hour or two. They would drive Mrs. Clark, their cooking teacher, crazy by sprinkling garlic liberally on every dish she taught them, from macaroni and cheese to southern fried chicken, nothing escaped a drenching with garlic powder. Toward the end of class, they would sit down to eat what they just learned to cook. Mrs. Clark would invariably be upset with the changes Mom and her friends made to her recipes. Eventually, she would succumb, toss up her hands as if to say, "You're all incorrigible,"



then would sit and enjoy the gossip and the joking among her students who were actually her friends.

How Long After the Death of My Dog Should I Wait to Get Another Dog?

The death of a beloved pet is heartbreaking and the grief does not go away overnight. Many owners struggle with the decision to get a new dog. How long should you wait before getting your next dog? Will you ever be ready to share your life with another dog?

There is no way for certain when the time is right to get a new dog. This is a very individual decision that often happens organically. Some people only wait days to weeks, possibly because they cannot bear to go too long without a canine companion. Others need several months to years before they are ready to bring a new dog into their lives. Some people even decide they no longer wish to have dogs. Instead, wait until you feel a sense of peace about your previous dog's death. Yes, you may still be grieving. However, it's best to be at a place where you are processing your grief and it does not dominate your life.

Consider other people living in your home: Spouses, partners, significant others, children, roommates, and other family members should have a voice. Are they ready to welcome a new dog into the home? Are they still grieving?

The decision to get a new dog should be one you make as a group. Have a household meetings to discuss what is on the minds of everyone in the home. Once you can all agree to get a new dog, you can then discuss details like what kind of dog to get and where to get the new dog. Choosing your new dog should also be a group process.

Consider your other pets: If you have any remaining pets, consider them before you add another dog to your home. Remember, that does grieve too (and so do other pets). Your dog or other pet may feel sad and

Make sure they are not showing any signs of illness. Once you are confident they are back to their normal selves, only then should you consider adding a new dog to your home. Once you get your new dog be sure to introduce all pets gradually and carefully.

Think about your own needs: Try to get an idea of what your life is now like without your dog. Are there goals or plans that you put off because of the care your previous dog needed? Maybe now is the time to take that long vacation or sabbatical. Does your home need repair or renovations? Perhaps it's a good time to revisit previous plans for going back to school, changing jobs, or relocating. It's better to make any lifestyle changes before adding a new dog to your life. 

A Nostalgic Remembrance



Tuesday morning, I was at a nearby condo complex playing bocce. A couple of mornings per week, I get together with a bunch of Italians from New York to compete in this game of Italian bowling. (My team lost, so I won't talk about it.)

During the middle of the first game, a rather rugged young man walked over to us, and being a city kid, I was immediately on guard ... you never know???? I relaxed as soon as he opened his mouth and said with a tear in his eye, "Have any of you seen my doggie?" At that point, he produced a picture of a male orange Pomeranian with white paws. All of the bocce players answered in the negative, and immediately felt sorry for the young man who evidently was distraught over his loss.

As I sat waiting my turn to roll a ball, I began to think about the dogs in my life and the generations of my family. According to stories Mom and Uncle Gino told me, Babbononno loved dogs. Back in the 1920s, he had a German shepherd that accompanied him everywhere except to work. My favorite story regarding Babbononno's dog was the time, at age 20 or 21, Mom and her girlfriend, Ada, who would marry Uncle Nick in the early 30s, wanted to see a Sunday matinee at the newly opened Seville Theater. Babbononno, looking at his watch, gave them a time limit. After all, it was Sunday and this meant that the family would be sitting down to a traditional mid-afternoon dinner.

Mom and Ada arrived at the Seville after the co-feature had started. Back in the day, you always were entertained with a co-feature, usually a B level movie, coming attractions, a cartoon, a newsreel, and maybe, a Three Stooges short subject. This combination was followed by the main feature. All combined, the time span was around four hours.

When the girls decided to stay and see the part of the co-feature they missed, Babbononno leashed up the German shepherd and headed for the Seville. When he arrived, he walked past the ticket booth, and past the man at the front door collecting tickets.

Once inside the darkened theater, he unleashed the dog and commanded, "Trova le ragazze, Angelina e Ada." (Find the girls, Angelina and Ada.)

The dog walked through the aisles and rows of seats sniffing the patrons until he found my mother and future aunt. At that point, he jumped on my mother's lap and let out a bark that summoned Babbononno down to the isle where they were sitting. He marched the girls and the dog out of the theater, reattaching the dog's leash to his collar in the lobby. No one stopped him and once home, the girls were grounded for a week or two, in spite of their ages, as I said, 20 or 21.

A generation later, I asked Mom and Dad for a dog. I always received the excuse that we lived in the city on the top floor of a three-decker and it was too difficult. When I was 15, a cop

stopped by the Seville where I was an usher. There was a call box just outside and the blue light was flashing. After answering the call, the officer came into the Seville lobby where I was sitting, watching the front door. Oh, I didn't mention, he was followed by a dog. He told me that the dog had followed him on his route and he couldn't get rid of him. He also assured me that he couldn't take him home as his mother was allergic to dogs. I brought the dog home after work and immediately discovered the dog was hungry and needed a bath. Following both, I had to put him outside and he was on his own again.

Fast forwarding to a point in time after we left East Boston and moved to Belmont, a lady friend I was enamored with was given a puppy but couldn't keep it due to her rental agreement, and so, I inherited Tammy, a female that was part lecherous father and promiscuous mother. She was a mutt from the word go, and my folks fell in love with her. There were no excuses regarding living on the 3rd floor in the middle of the city, and Tammy became my father's dog until the day, many years later, she had to be put down.

My mother was beside herself and Loretta and I decided to rectify the situation. We had heard about a Keeshond that was for sale and purchased her for my folks who, at first, rejected the idea of another dog. But, within a day or two, Mom named her Keesha and she became a part of their family for the next few

When my sons, John and Michael were in their preteen years, Loretta and I adopted a beagle from a friend whose dog had a litter of pups. The boys immediately fell in love with the dog and named him Beagsley.

For the next few years, Beagsley went everywhere the boys did. When Loretta dropped them off at school, the dog was in the car. When they played basketball or baseball after school, one of the fans who cheered them on (barking that is) was Beagsley, who usually sat next to me in the stands. When I bought a boat, the dog was the lookout usually standing on the front deck as we headed east along the Mystic River.

Once the boys were away at college, the dog checked their bedrooms each night and slept on the floor at the foot of the steps leading to their rooms. Late one Saturday afternoon, I was dressing to head out to play with my band. When the phone rang, a person on the other end said, "It's 6:15, do you know where your dog is?" It was the vet that often serviced the dog's medical needs. I looked in the back yard where Beagsley had been and there was no dog there. When I returned to the phone, the vet told me that a baseball coach at a nearby little league field had spotted a dog running the bases, checked his dog tags and called the number stamped on one of them.

I had enough time and headed for the field. I walked up to the coach and must have looked out of place wearing a tuxedo to a little league field. The coach told me that the dog arrived alone and headed out to second base, the position both my boys played during their youthful baseball careers. I apologized and headed toward Beagsley with a leash in hand. After I had him under my control, the coach, kiddingly asked me if he could keep the dog at second base as he was a better ball player than the kid covering the base. I brought him home instead. He was with us for 16 years before his time was up. I keep his memory alive using Beagsley as part of my email address. In closing, I hope that young man who lost his Pomeranian finds his dog, he was almost in tears when he asked us, "Have you seen my doggie?" GOD BLESS AMERICA



CAKE OF THE SEVEN JARS Torte Dei Sette Vasetti

1 jar plain yogurt, room temperature3 eggs, room temperature 2 jars granulated sugar Zest of 1 organic lemon 2 jars '00 or all-purpose flour 1 jar potato starch

1 jar sunflower seed or vegetable oil 1 16 gram sachet Italian baking powder with vanilla flavoring (may substitute 2 ½ teaspoons baking powder and 1 teaspoon vanilla) Icing/Powdered sugar

Preheat oven to 350°. Take a 22 cm baking pan (I use a ciambella pan), butter and flour well, set aside. Empty yogurt in a small bowl, put aside. Wash and dry yogurt container, this will now become your measuring jar (vasetti). Place eggs and 2 jars granulated sugar in medium bowl, beat about 5 minutes, or until light yellow in color. Add lemon zest and yogurt, whisk together. While whisking, slowly add 1 jar oil. Add 2 jars flour, 1 jar potato starch, beat well. Finally, add sachet of baking powder and continue beating until mixed thoroughly. Place batter in prepared baking pan, even with spatula. Bake at 350° for 35-45 minutes or until golden brown and toothpick inserted comes out clean. Cool, remove from pan and sprinkle with icing/powdered sugar.

The Boston Molasses Flood



The crushed firehouse

To this day summer walks in the North End of Boston bear invisible though ever-present reminders of a century old tragedy. When the temperature gets a little hot one can still get a scent of molasses in the air. For it was the North End that was most heavily impacted when the 58ft molasses tank located next to the United States Industrial Alcohol building exploded on January 15, 1919.

It had been an unusually warm January and the 2.5 million gallons of hot molasses brewing in the tank was, unbeknownst to the workers, about to

give way. At around noon, with the heat from the temperature and the tank, the bolts blew out and the giant tank gave way . Hot molasses swept through the streets, toppling the fire house (killing fireman George Layhe), damaging the Industrial Alcohol building, smashing through its windows and killing the workers inside (Patrick Breen, William Brogan, John Callahan, William Duffy, Peter Francis, James H.

Kenneally, Eric Laird, James Lennon, Peter Shaughnessy, John M. Seiberlich, Thomas Noonan and James McMullen), collapsing the support beams of the Boston Elevated Railway Atlantic Avenue structure and hurling a truck into the Boston Harbor.

House, vehicles, people, horses, and debris were swept by the wave. Tenement houses in the area were destroyed, resulting in the death of Bridget and Stephen Clougherty and two children (Maria DiStasio and Pasquale Inatosca, both aged 10).




weeks and involved many residents from the area and the surrounding towns. The Boston Harbor remained brown until that summer.

Residents affected filed a class-action lawsuit against United States Alcohol Industrial Company which was found negligible in constructing a substandard tank. The company paid \$628,000 in damages and chose not to rebuild the tank.

Today the site is still a cultural marker in the North End community. Langone Park offers beautiful views of the Harbor and is a popular hangout for bocce tournaments. A plaque there states:

"On January 15, 1919, a molasses tank at 529 Commercial Street exploded under pressure, killing 21 people. A 40-foot wave of molasses buckled the elevated railroad tracks, crushed buildings and inundated the neighborhood. Structural defects in the tank combined with unseasonably warm temperatures contributed to the disaster."







HOOPS and HOCKEY in the HUB

THEY SHOT THE LIGHTS OUT - It was the game of games, an atmosphere that playground players dream about. But it wasn't played outdoors in the summer weather on pavement.

No, this basketball contest took place in the comfy confines of the original Boston Garden on a winter day. But what took place — in terms of scoring would melt even the most resilient iceberg.

It was a regular season NBA game between the Celtics and the Minneapolis Lakers some 61 years ago (February 27, 1959) that still has those who used pencils to manually record the proceedings in scorebooks back then wondering how they managed to keep up with the pace of it all.

Because when it had concluded some 173 points had been scored. But that was just by one team — the Boston Celtics. The Minneapolis Lakers? Well they lost by a lot but their final tally would have won most NBA games in the modern era. Yes sir, those fellows from the Upper Midwest had found the range for 139 tallies of their own.

After all, how many NBA teams can actually say they scored 139 points and still lost? And also remember: the final score in this 312-point game (173-139) was achieved without the three-point shot — which would not debut in the NBA until the start of the 1979-1980 season. This leaves one to wonder how high the score would have been if the three-pointer could have been deployed that day as an offensive weapon.

The combined scoring total was a record for its time. It has since been exceeded on numerous occasions, especially in the era of the three-point shot. But to this day the 173 points scored by the Celtics remains atop the record book in a shared capacity with Phoenix as the most points scored by one team in regulation - without going into overtime. Phoenix tied the Celtics' total with a 173-143 victory over Denver back on November 10,

Those in the stands that day at the Garden had a feeling that this would not be a normal NBA game when the two teams combined for 70 points in just the first quarter with the Celtics holding a 40-30 lead at that point. By the half the C's and the Lakers had added another 75 points with the Celtics holding an 83-64 lead at intermission.

Starting the third quarter it apparently took the two clubs a bit of time to get warmed up again. It was the lowest scoring period of the contest with the Celtics scoring 38 and the Lakers only 31.

But the final quarter is when the scoring really went to higher levels with both teams producing more points in the final 12 minutes than they had in any other previous quarter. By the time the final stanza had wound down the Celtics had added another 52 tallies to their total. Meanwhile, the Lakers had come away with another 44 — their best quarter of the game.

This might sound odd given the score but what seems to have done the Lakers in was poor shooting. Minneapolis connected on only 47 of its 124 field goal attempts for a lowly .379 percentage. The Celtics, on the other hand, made 72 of their 143 attempts, good enough for a .503 percentage.

As far as individual efforts are concerned, Tom Heinsohn was very active on the court that day, leading all scorers with 43 points as he made good on 18 of his 28 field goal attempts for a .643 shooting percentage to go with his seven points from the foul line. And he did all that scoring by playing only 36 minutes.

By contrast, Bob Cousy played in 45 minutes of the 48-minute contest. He wound up with 31 points. But that doesn't tell the whole story. Cousy also had 28 assists, meaning he actually had a hand in an additional 28 successful shots from the field. Those additional shots added up to 56 points — meaning that The Cooz had actually been a factor in 87 of the 173 points (close to half) scored by the Celtics.

Other impressive scorers for the Celtics included Bill Sharman with 29, Frank Ramsey with 20, and Gene Conley - who also played for the Red Sox at one point is his career — with 14.

On the other side of the ledger, Elgin Baylor, who would go on to be named the NBA Rookie of the Year, led the Lakers with 28 points. Fully half of those came from the charity stripe as Baylor went a perfect 14 of 14 from the foul line. Vern Mikkelsen added 25 points while Hot Rod Hundley wound up with 21.

For the Celtics it was their 49^{th} victory of the season. It would be the 29th setback of the year for the Lakers.

However, there was more to be written for these two teams in the 1959 portion of the 1958-1959 NBA season.

The Celtics would go on to finish the regular season with a record of 52-20, good enough for first place in the Eastern Division. The C's were a dominating 26-4 on the parquet that season. They received a bye in the divisional semifinals before going against the Syracuse Nationals. It was a seven-game series but the Celtics prevailed 130-125 in Game 7 at the Garden on April 1st.

The Lakers (33-39) would finish second to the Saint Louis Hawks in the Western Division. They defeated Detroit in an opening three-game series and then took out the Hawks in six games to advance to the NBA Finals against the Celtics.

This would be the first meeting of the two teams in the NBA Finals. The Celtics did not disappoint, sweeping Minneapolis 4-0 on April 9th to capture their second NBA Championship.

Three players — Bob Cousy, Bill Russell, and Bill Sharman would be named to the All-NBA First Team. Significantly, those three players led the league in three statistical categories that year — Russell in rebounding (1,612), Cousy in assists (557), and Sharman in free throw shooting percentage (.932).

All in all a great season for the Green — best remembered not only for the NBA Championship but also for the game in which They Shot The Lights Out.
