Florida Congressman Speaking at Mass GOP State Convention

The keynote speaker at the upcoming state GOP convention in Springfield will be U.S. Rep. Byron Donalds. The Florida congressman's district includes Fort Myers. He was born in Brooklyn before his family moved to Florida. He very often shows up on both Fox News Channel and Newsmax.

He was first elected in 2020 after defeating his Democrat opponent by a large margin and made history last year when the Congressional Black Caucus refused to admit him as a member. Prior to that, he was a state legislator in the Florida House.

The state convention will be held on May 21st at the MassMutual Center in Springfield.

As a Senator, Biden once voted to overturn Roe v. Wade. However, in reacting to the recent leaked draft opinion that suggests the Court is ready to overturn the 1973 ruling, Biden said it "concerns me ... that we're gonna, after 50 years, decide a woman does not have a right to choose."

However, back in 1974, he told *The Washingtonian*: "I think (the Court) went too far. I don't think that a woman has the sole right to say what should happen to her body."

Again in 1982, he backed a Constitutional Amendment that would allow individual states to overturn Roe v.


Stirpe Nostra

JULIUS CAESAR, POST-MORTEM



Julius Caesar's will named his sisters, his grandsons, and Octavius to inherit three quarters of his estate. He also adopted Octavius and gave him the Caesar name.

A funeral pyre was erected in the Campus Martius and he was cremated while lying on an ivory couch with covers of purple and gold. The robe that he was wearing when slain hung at the head of the couch. Instead of a eulogy at the cremation, Antonius (Marc Antony) arranged to have someone recite the decree of the senate, which voted Caesar all divine and human honors, and also the pledge of the senators to watch over his personal safety. During the cremation, some people tore off their robes and threw them onto the fire. Many women threw their jewelry and also the robes of their children.

There was a strong suspicion that Caesar had taken no precautions against conspirators because of his failing health, and a desire to bring his suffering to an end. Others theorize that his confidence in the senatorial pledge to watch over his safety caused him to dismiss his armed bodyguards. He often said that it was in the interest of Rome that he remain alive, and that if any harm befell him the country would be thrown into civil strife far worse than they had ever seen. All persons close to him agreed that his sudden and unexpected death was the kind he preferred (as opposed to one of lingering or suffering)

Caesar died in the 56th year of his life. He was numbered among the gods by formal decree and also in the opinion of the people he served. It is said that for seven days in succession, a comet was seen about an hour before sunset, and this was believed to be his soul being taken to heaven. The senate voted that the room in which Caesar was slain be walled up and never used again. They also voted that the Ides of March be called the Day of Parricide (murder of one or both parents) and that the senate would never meet on that day. Most of Caesar's conspirators died an unnatural death within the next three years. They died in shipwrecks, in battle, or by suicide with the same dagger used on

Julius Caesar holds a very unique place in the history of Rome and of the world. During his time, the government of Rome was not adequate to meet the administrative needs of such a great empire. Military power became more important than civil power, and great senatorial debates had to give way to violent battles between successful leaders of Roman legions. Caesar was ambitious. He desired to become the greatest political leader of his generation, and was successful because of his extraordinary executive ability. He possessed a better knowledge of the needs of Rome than any of his contemporaries. His genius was not merely destructive, as some might have said, but was constructive as well.

He was a great statesman, and his military accomplishments rank him equal to Alexander the Great, Hannibal. and Napoleon. In the oratory of his day, he was second only to Cicero. As a writer, he is placed among the world's greatest.

His height, fair complexion, sensitive regard for his appearance, and gracious attitude truly marked him as a man of the world. In ambition, energy, and the ability to get things done, he has made a greater mark on humanity than any other man that ever lived. Good work cousin Julius, I'm proud

And now, the bitter irony of fate. The building in which the Roman Senate met was called the Curia. At that time, their Curia was destroyed by fire. Pompey built a building for the senate to use while they awaited completion of a new Curia. The temporary meeting hall was called "Pompey's Senate House." Just four years after completion of Pompey's Senate House, his army was defeated by Caesar and Pompey himself was murdered on a desolate Egyptian sea coast. Four years after Pompey's death, Caesar himself was murdered in Pompey's Senate House.





MFA Boston Transfers Antique Marble Head to the Republic of Italy

The Museum of Fine Arts, Boston (MFA) has transferred the Late Imperial sculpture Portrait of a Man to the Republic of Italy, from where it is believed to have been stolen during World War II. The marble head dates to the 3rd or 4th century C.E. Its features were re-cut in antiquity from an earlier portrait, and it may represent the emperor Maximianus Herculius. It was found in December 1931 at Minturno, Italy, during a series of excavations undertaken by the University of Pennsylvania and the Superintendency of Campania in Naples. The head was published, inventoried and illustrated in a catalogue of sculptures from the excavations in 1938. During World War II, a number of archaeological finds and other works of art stored at Minturno were stolen, probably by German troops, or were otherwise dispersed in the upheaval of war. The Portrait of a Man was almost certainly taken at this time. After it was photographed in the 1930s, the sculpture suffered damage and lost its nose.

The Museum purchased the sculpture from the Swiss gallery Münzen und Medaillen in 1961, with no documentation of its collecting history. In July 2019, Professor Irene Bald Romano of the University of Arizona, who has published on sculptures from Minturno and is working on a publication



on the fate of antiquities during the Nazi era, alerted MFA staff that the head had gone missing from Italy during World War II. This information prompted an investigation of the sculpture's provenance. After verifying its excavation at Minturno and the loss of artwork there during the war, the Museum wrote to the Italian Ministry of Culture to inform them of the sculpture's whereabouts in September 2019. The Ministry affirmed the MFA's findings in July 2020 and requested that the head be returned.

Provenance Research

The MFA is a leader in the field of provenance research, employing a full-time Curator for Provenance, who works

Museum to research and document the MFA's collection on an ongoing basis. Findings are included in the Museum's online collections database. The MFA follows the highest standards of professional practice in regards to issues of ownership and in its response to claims for works in the collection. If research demonstrates that a work of art has been stolen, confiscated or unlawfully appropriated without subsequent restitution, then the Museum will notify potential claimants, and seek to resolve the matter in an equitable, appropriate and mutually agreeable manner. A list of ownership resolutions at the Museum since the late 1990s can be found in Ownership Resolutions.

L'Anno Bello: A Year in Italian Folklore

Out and About in the Great Outdoors

Around this time of year, I feel a sense of energy bubbling up inside me. All of the cabin fever and restless excitement over a new spring evaporates into the warm air, a surge of iov and release as refreshing as an afternoon rain shower. As the temperatures hit everhigher degrees, I can practically smell the summer in the air, the promise of barbecues and ocean waves and ice-cold glasses of lemonade. When class is dismissed at the school where I teach and students run out into the luminous day, their unbridled happiness is contagious as they scamper across the bright green, sun-soaked grass. Indeed, the month of May as a whole calls for outdoor excursions. Traditionally the beginning of summer, May heralds warmer temperatures and an explosion of tender leaves on trees. It is definitely not a month to stay cooped up indoors, but rather one to venture outside and revel in all the delights nature has to offer. From Italian traditions to nature-based holidays, the call of the wild proves most exciting in May.

In Italy, one of the most beloved traditions is called la passeggiata, or evening stroll. After dinner, Italian families and friends meander through city streets or rural lanes, enjoying the outdoor experience and each other's company. In urban areas, la passeggiata may involve stopping for some delicious, creamy gelato, casual window shopping, or sitting and chatting along the rim of one of Italy's many beautiful fountains. People in the countryside may rest in the shade of trees, pick fruit, or pack a small

age where too many people are tempted to watch television right after dinner, I love the idea of a tradition that encourages people to step outside and partake in the universal and time-honored pleasures of fresh air, loved ones and the nourishment of food and drink. I fondly remember my evening passeggiate from when I visited Italy several years ago: the walks through bustling city centers, where the late-day sun turned ancient ruins to the color of gold, and the hikes along dirt roads in my dad's home region of Abruzzo, watching the dusky sky darken the mountains. My husband loves to go outside and walk, so often I will try to recreate la passeggiata here at home. As I walk around my neighborhood in this balmy month of May, I pay special attention to the life all around me: jubilant children kicking a soccer ball, robins hopping among blades of grass, the sun peeking through branches laden with delicate pink flowers.

May brims with a number of special holidays that encourage such outdoor excursions. The month begins with May Day, an ancient holiday celebrating the start of summer. It is also a holiday honoring flowers and trees, which are their most beautiful now. Mother's Day, which occurred on the 8th of the month this year, not only allows us to express gratitude for the wonderful things mothers do for us but also prompts us to enjoy their company. On Mother's Day, my family and I often go out for ice cream, an activity all the more special because of its simplicity and its unencumbered focus on loved ones, food, and the warm sun. Soon, it will picnic of sweets and wine. In an $\;\;$ be Memorial Day, and countless families will fire up the grill and eat summer produce outdoors. Others will flock to the beach or the mountains — any outdoor place will do, as Memorial Day weekend is considered the unofficial start of summer! Earlier, however, this May will have hosted another summer holiday, Ascension Day, known as la Festa dell'Ascensione in Italian. Falling forty days after Easter, this holiday commemorates Jesus's ascent into Heaven. Italians celebrate it with outdoor excursions and picnics, as typical for the holidays of May. Another feast known as la Pasqua Rossa, or Pentecost, falls fifty days after Easter and honors the descent of the Holy Spirit upon Jesus's disciples. Italian churches often scatter rose petals during the services to symbolize the Holy Spirit, incorporating a lovely outdoor symbol of summer.

This month, be sure to spend an abundant amount of time enjoying nature. 

St. Eric IX of Sweden

Erik IX — also called Eric Jedvardsson, Eric the Lawgiver, and Saint Erik — was a Swedish king and Catholic saint, reigning from around 1150 to May 18, 1160. For a king, Erik is something of a mystery - no contemporary Swedish historical accounts discuss him. The only detailed account of Erik's rule is found in the Catholic legend constructed after he achieved sainthood, describing him as a devoted Christian who codified Swedish law and led a crusade against Finland. Despite the lack of biographical details, Erik is well-known to modern Swedes. He is the patron saint of Stockholm, featuring in the city's coat of arms, and his elaborate reliquary is displayed in the Uppsala Cathedral.

Saint Eric's skull shows signs of healed wounds that may have occurred in battle, aligning with the tales of a Finnish crusade. According to the researchers, "The saint's legend says that

in the king's final battle, the enemy swarmed him, and when he fell to the ground they gave him wound after wound until he lay half dead. They then taunted him and finally cut off his head." True to legend, Eric's bones show signs of cuts inflicted in connection with his death and indicate that he was laying face-down during the injuries. Furthermore, one of his neck vertebra was cut through; not only is this consistent with decapitation, the injury could not have been inflicted during battle as the armor worn at the time would protect that part of the neck. This aligns with the legend's assertion that he was swarmed in battle, captured, and taunted prior to his decapitation.

Eric spread the Faith throughout the nation after his crowning in 1150. He campaigned against the pagan Finns and persuaded Bishop Henry of Uppsala, an Englishman, to remain in missionary service in Finland. Eric was slain by Swedish nobles who were allies of Prince Magnus of Denmark. They beheaded him near Uppsala as Magnus' army entered the region. Eric was never officially canonized but is patron of Sweden. Saint Eric's Feast Day is May 18th.



Growing Tomatoes in Pots

Keep garden-fresh tomatoes close at hand this season. Grow one or more in containers on your patio, balcony, or front steps.

Any tomato can be grown in a pot, but determinate varieties are smaller and more compact, so they are a bit easier to manage in a container. They produce fruit in a relatively short period of time, making them great choices for preserving as well as using fresh. Look for a D or determinate on the plant tag, seed packet or in the catalog description.

Indeterminate tomatoes, often identified with an I, are large, sprawling plants. These are usually staked or grown in wire cages to save space, reduce pest problems and make harvesting easier. They continue to grow, flower, and produce fruit until the frost kills the plant. Indeterminate tomatoes usually produce more tomatoes, but the harvest is later in the season than determinate varieties. New containers with built-in trellises or creative gardeners crafting their own makes growing indeterminate tomatoes in pots an easier possibility.

Grow one tomato per container for maximum productivity. Use a 5-gallon or bigger container for large varieties and at least a two to three gallon or similar size pot for smaller varieties. Some research suggests growing tomatoes in a pot that is at least 14 inches but preferably 20 inches wide will yield greater results. Adding flowers and herbs to the container boosts the beauty and diversity of your container garden but will reduce the number of tomatoes produced.

Growing tomatoes in containers also allows you to extend the season. Start earlier by moving the planter inside when the weather is harsh and back outside when the weather is warm and sunny. As the weather turns cold at the end of the growing season, cover the planter or move it into a frost-free location as needed.

Some gardeners even move a pot or two inside to finish off the tomato season.

Grow tomatoes in a container with drainage holes or a self-watering pot that has a reservoir to hold water and extend the time between watering. Further reduce the need to water by adding an organic, sustainable soil amendment like Wild Valley Farms' wool pellets (wildvalleyfarms.com) to the potting mix. Made from wool waste, this product reduces watering by up to 25%. Adding a low nitrogen, slow-release fertilizer at planting will eliminate the need to fertilize weekly. Just make a second application, if needed, mid season.

Plant tall tomato transplants a few inches deeper than they were growing in their container. Remove the lowest leaves that would otherwise be buried in

the soil. Cover with soil and water. This is also a good time to install any stakes, trellises, or cages to support taller varieties.

Initially, check tomatoes growing in containers every day and water often enough to keep the developing root system moist. Reduce watering frequency as plants become established. Feel the top few inches of soil and water the established plants thoroughly whenever this is dry. Mulch the soil with evergreen needles, shredded leaves, or other organic mulch to keep the soil consistently moist and suppress weeds. Consistent soil moisture encourages more flowering and fruiting, while reducing the risk of blossom end rot, cracking, and misshapen fruit.

Harvest tomatoes when fully colored or leave them on the plant a few more days for an even sweeter flavor. You'll enjoy the convenience of harvesting fresh tomatoes right outside your door for use in salads, sauces, and other favorite recipes.

A Nostalgic Remembrance



In two days the column called "Nanna and Babbononno" will be 31 years old. That means I've written 1,612 stories since May 15, 1991!!! I never knew I would have that much to say. Since this is an anniversary column, permit me to tell you how it all began.

I was not new to writing, as I had been penning a column for the Boston Musicians' Union magazine, Prelude. My column, "A La Breve," was a depiction of who the men and women of the musicians' union were and where they were playing, past and present. One Sunday night, my wife, Loretta, and I were at Dean and Margie Saluti's for a dinner party and I was introduced to Pam Donnaruma, our publisher and editor. I had known of the Post-Gazette from when I was a child and Babbononno would read it to me, translating it from Italian to English, but I had not seen a copy of it since my grandfather passed away and didn't know that it was now in English.

Pam and I conversed for a bit, and in the conversation, she mentioned that one of her writers was leaving and she would be looking for a replacement. I asked how I could help and was given the opportunity of penning a column, but there was a problem ... What should or could I write about? My musicians' magazine column was of no importance to the population that read the Post-Gazette. Dad and I sat down the next day to discuss my dilemma and he reminded me of the culture I came from and the family life I experienced as a second generation Italian American (without the hyphen). He went on to say, "You've lived in a close knit family composed of three generations of people, the first generation born in Italy, the second, the first born in America and the third, yours. I know that with your memory, you probably remember things that you've experienced since you were in a high chair."

I thought over what Dad had to say, and reflected on my relationships with family members: my parents, my grandparents (Mom's side), my uncles and aunts, my Godfather Uncle Nick, and my cousins. When I might be able to identify with a typical Italian family making it in America.

That first column began with Babbononno coming to America. He didn't emigrate here like so many of his countrymen did. My grandfather was in the Royal Italian Marines, and played drum in their traveling band. Traditionally, the Italian Marine Band serenaded in Washington once a year. It all began when Thomas Jefferson was president and continued through the presidency of Harry Truman. The year was 1896 and Michele Contini (Babbononno) was 21 years old.

While the band was in Washington, my grandfather was notified by the Reuters service that his wife had died in childbirth. He was devastated and when the band returned to Italy, he resigned his commission and stayed in Washington. There was nothing there for an Italian, especially one who couldn't speak English. He had heard that there was a sizable Italian population in New Orleans and he traveled there only to discover that in 1890, the police chief was assassinated and the population blamed the Italians, had lynched several just on looks alone, and were still out for blood in 1896. Babbononno quickly left the south and headed for New York, but was overwhelmed by the size of the city. He next landed in Boston and wound up in the North End where three ethnic groups seemed to exist side by side, Jewish, Irish and Italian. While sitting in a café, he struck up a conversation with a man named Antonio Ceruolo. He was a plasterer who did hand scroll carving on ceiling cornices and chandelier bases, and was making a decent weeks pay. As a result, he was bringing his siblings to Boston from Avellino, one by one, and not in steerage the way he traveled here.

When he felt that he could trust Michele Contini, he mentioned that one of his roommates was leaving and there would be a vacancy to fill. Babbononno took him up on it and moved to a flat on Salem Street that was occupied by Antonio and three other Italian men. Antonio helped his new put all of it together, I knew that friend find work as a furniture the readers of the Post-Gazette maker and finisher, a trade he

had learned from a priest back in his home town of Foggia. He networked with a few local neighborhood musicians, and as a guitarist played the Italian songs of the day. As a drummer, he joined a marching band and played concerts and several of Boston's parades. When the money came rolling in, Antonio said to his new friend, "Benvenuto in America." (Welcome to America)

Antonio soon married the love of his life, a diminutive Italian girl named Maria, whom we all called Zi'Mariuccia. (Aunt Little Mary). He gave up the North End apartment and bought a house in East Boston and moved his married sisters and their families into it.

One day he showed Michele a picture of his youngest sister who was the next in line to come to America. Babbononno liked what he saw in the picture and accompanied Zi' Antonio to New York to intercept her when she arrived through Ellis Island.

Giovannina Ceruolo and Michele Contini hit it off right away, but due to Antonio's insistence, they were never to be left alone. Even back then, musicians had reputations when it came to the ladies. Well, they courted and eventually married at the long-gone Mt Carmel Parish in East Boston. Babbononno had Zi'Antonio by

As time went on and my future grandparents settled in and became Americanized, Michele became Michael and Giovannina became Jenny. Jenny found a job doing hand tailoring on men's clothing and heard gossip and rumors about her husband. She ignored it but confronted one of the gossipers one day who told her that she heard that her husband, Michael, had a wife and children back in Italy, and once he had enough money was going back to them. When she confronted her husband with the gossip she had been hearing, Babbononno admitted he had been married and that his wife had died in child birth. He added the fact that he had two children who were being brought up by his mother, my great grandmother, Maria. He confessed that he never told Nanna due to the fact that he feared she wouldn't marry him.

Italy is the world's largest producer of carciofi (artichokes) and throughout the country each region appears to have its own artichoke specialty. This Festa del Carciofo celebrates the artichokes that grow on only one side of this small town. Sacred too many, because years ago artichokes were the staple that many families from this region depended on for survival.

In my family, stuffed artichokes were something that was typically made only for holidays or special Sunday dinners. My Nonna used a bread and cheese stuffing to stuff hers, and they were absolutely amazing. If you like stuffed artichokes, you are going to absolutely love my Nonna's version of "Stuffed Artichoke Casserole." It's a recipe that was given to her many years ago. Though it's incredibly easy to make, it results in one of the most delicious side dishes you'll ever have. Casseruola di Carciofi Ripieni is perfect when served with beef or poultry, and undeniably magnificent when accompanying ham or lamb!



- 3 8-9-ounce packages frozen artichoke hearts or 3 cans of quartered artichoke hearts, chopped
- 2 organic lemons, one zested and juiced, one quartered 6 garlic cloves, pressed or finely chopped 1 to 2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley Salt and freshly ground


pepper, to taste

3/4 cup olive oil

Preheat the oven to 375°. Grease a casserole dish and set aside. In a large bowl, add the breadcrumbs, ½ cup of the cheese, chopped artichokes, the zest and juice of one lemon, garlic, parsley, ½ cup of the olive oil, and add salt and black pepper to taste. With your hands, mix all of the ingredients together well and place the mixture into the prepared casserole dish. Drizzle with the remaining 1/4 cup olive oil, sprinkle with the remaining grated cheese, and squeeze two of the lemon quarters over the top, reserving the remaining two to use after cooking, if desired. Cover with aluminum foil and bake for 30 minutes. Carefully remove foil and bake uncovered for another 15 minutes. Enjoy!

ROBIN ROBERTS

Was One of a Kind on the Baseball Mound

"I stood out there in total isolation. When I was pitching well. I only saw the catcher."

- Robin Roberts



Robin Roberts pitched for 19 seasons beginning on June 18, 1948, when he was 21 and his last appearance was on August 29, 1966 when he was 38. Roberts entered the Hall of Fame about 10 years after retiring, which seemed so wrong. Part of the reason had to do with his last few seasons when his pitching was no longer that great.

His career stats are quite impressive. His win-loss lifetime record was 286-245 back in the day when baseball was full of "Iron Horses" on the mound whose goal

was never to be relieved in a game. Their job was to pitch innings and that is what they did game after game. He struck out 2,957 batters and his lifetime ERA was 3.41. In 1950 at age 23, he led the Phillies "Whiz Kids" to their first NL pennant in 35 years. At the end of that season, he started three of the last five games, I kid you not, and defeated the Brooklyn Dodgers at Ebbets Field in a pennant-deciding series ending in a 10-inning game winning his 20th win of that season and was the first 20 game winner in The City of Brotherly Love since Grover Alexander Cleveland in 1917. Between 1952-55, he led the NL in wins, sixth in games started, fifth in complete games, and pitched 26 complete games in a row, going 17 innings in one of them.

His 28 wins in 1952 won him the Sporting News Pitcher of the Year, and it was the most wins by a pitcher since Dizzy Dean won 28 in 1935. His best season, though, was 1953, when he went 23-16, striking out 198 batters in 346.2 innings. He finished with a 2.75 ERA, second to Warren Spahn's 2.10 ERA.

In 1954, May 13th to be exact, he gave up a lead off home run to the Cincinnati Reds' Bobby Adams before settling down and retiring 27 consecutive batters to win the game 8-1 on a one hitter. His win-loss record with the Phillies from 1948-61 was 234-199. He signed with the Baltimore Orioles on May 21, 1962, and in 3.5 seasons, he went 42-36 with a 3.09 ERA. In his first season with Baltimore, his road roommate was a young Jim Palmer. In 2009, Palmer observed, "Roberts helped teach me even though he knew I was probably going to take his job." Roberts is also the only pitcher to beat the Braves in Boston, Milwaukee, and Atlanta. His final win came off the Pirates in Forbes Field on September 3, 1966.

Over his amazing career, he threw 305 complete games to go with his 45 shutouts. and played for the Phillies, Orioles, Astros, and finally the Cubbies. The Phillies retired his number, 36.

I remember his bad year in1961 with Philadelphia, when he went 1-10 with a 5.85 OUCH ERA. The Phillies traded him to the Orioles where he went 10-9 with a 2.78 ERA in 1962, and won the Comeback Player of the Year Award. He hung on a few more years, winning 14 games in 1963.

I believe Robin Roberts was one of the best pitchers in baseball during the 1950s, and I only wish I had been slightly older to have seen him pitch in his prime. However, he kept his class right up to 1966, when he proudly retired after a career worth noting forever as a baseball icon and legend to be honored. In his prime, what pitcher past or present was better. NONE I SAY!

What Do You Call a Fighter with 65 Losses? If it's Fritzie Zivic — You Call Him Great



Fritzie Zivic, the Croat Comet, had a career record of 231 fights with 157 wins, 65 losses, and 9 draws. He scored 81 kayos, and was stopped only 4 times. Today's fans would focus in on those losses and say Zivic couldn't have been very good. Well, a few of

The Croat Comet things should be considered. First is whom did he fight. Another is how often did he fight. Also, how frequently were his matches. Take the year 1938 for example. Fritzie fought 22 times in that one year alone. He fought Charley Burley twice in that year, winning and losing a decision.

The next year he fought 20 times. In 1940, he climbed through the ropes 17 tines, and in 1941, he slowed up a bit going at it 14 times. Those 14 bouts included a stoppage of Henry Armstrong from whom he had won the World Welterweight Title the previous year, and the first of two fights he had against Sugar Ray Robinson.

Zivic fought from 1931 until 1949, a total of 18 years. To put the comparison in context with champions in more recent times, if I were to write a story a week about each one of Fritzie's fights it would take me four and a half years to cover all of them. If I was writing about Floyd Mayweather's career, it would take less than one year.

The list of great fighters Zivic fought is a long one. He ducked nobody and anyone who stepped into the ring with him knew they were in a fight.

Here's a partial list of his opponents: In Addition to his fights with Sugar Ray Robinson, Henry Armstrong, and Charley Burley, Zivic took on Kid Azteca, Jake LaMotta, Cocoa Kid, Tommy Bell, Bob Montgomery, Beau Jack, Izzy Jannazzo, Lew Jenkins, Al Bummy Davis, Sammy Angott, Billy Conn, and Lou Ambers. Nobody, and I mean

nobody today takes on anything near that quality of opposition. Nobody fights anywhere near that often. And nobody comes close to being as tough as Fritzie Zivic.

Boxing ain't baseball. The stats don't tell the whole story. Sure, Fritzie lost that many bouts, but look who he took on. Look how he did in those losing battles, and then look at the people he defeated. There is no question Zivic is so far ahead of those fighting today that it would be criminal to match him up against any of them if he were still with us. Context is important when looking at history. This is especially true in boxing.

HOOPS and HOCKEY in the HUB

TAKING THEIR TIME — If you are thinking that the first round of this year's Stanley Cup Playoffs has been lengthy, you are correct. Midway through the second week of May, it was certain that six of the series were destined for at least six games.

That's the most since the 1991 playoffs when all eight opening round playoff matchups went at least six games with three moving on to a decisive seventh game.

During the current first round, Pittsburgh's Sidney Crosby scored his 200th playoff point, putting him in fifth place on the alltime career playoff points list and just one behind Jaromir Jagr, one of our favorite players, who was briefly a Bruin in the spring of 2013. By the time you read this Crosby may well have tied (or moved past) the Ageless One, who continues to play for a team in the Czech Republic.

But Crosby won't catch Wayne Gretzky, who concluded his spectacular career with 382 playoff points — 107 more than Mark Messier, who is second with 295.

NOT ALL SMILES WITH THE ISLES — When New York Islanders president Lou Lamoriello fired head coach Barry Trotz on May 9th, it brought back memories of similar actions that directly impacted some coaches who would go on to become the leaders behind the Bruins bench.

It was back in 2000, when Lamoriello, in his capacity as general manager of the New Jersey Devils, fired Needham native Robbie Ftorek with just eight games left in the season. Ftorek's replacement, Larry Robinson, went on to lead the team to the Stanley Cup. But Larry didn't last long with Lou: he too was fired just two years later — one of eight head coaches fired by Lamoriello in his first 16 seasons as GM of the Devils.

Ftorek became the head coach of the Bruins in 2001, but had only moderate success over the course of two seasons. He was dismissed with nine games remaining in the 2002-2003 season. He later coached with Albany and then Erie in the American Hockey League.

Like Ftorek, Claude Julien also felt Lamoriello's lash when he was dismissed as the head coach of the Devils with three games to go in the 2006-2007 regular season. This was one of the all-time stunners since Julien's team was leading the Atlantic Division and was tied for second place in the Eastern Conference when the hammer came down. Lamoriello then took over as head coach but only got to the conference semifinals before elimination.

Former Bruins coach Pat Burns was the only one of the three who left the Devils' coaching staff on his own terms — and unfortunately they were not the best of terms.

Before he did that though, Burns, one of our favorite Bruins coaches in the three decades we have covered the team, won a Stanley Cup with the Devils in 2003. However, Burns was diagnosed with cancer in 2004 and resigned in 2005 in order to concentrate on his medical treatment, though he remained with the team in a non-coaching capacity.

Pat Burns was the only coach to win the NHL's Jack Adams Award (Coach of the Year) with three different teams: Montreal in 1989, Toronto in 1993, and with Boston in 1998.

We will always remember that sad November day in 2010 as we were driving on the New York Thruway when it came over the radio that Pat Burns had died of cancer. He was 58 years old.

THE WINTERS ARE BETTER HERE — At least when the Bruins and Celtics are playing. After all, it hasn't been that long since both teams went all the way to the championship round in their respective playoffs.

Consider the Celtics. Sure, it has been a while since the Celtics defeated the Los Angeles Lakers for the NBA title back in 2008. But don't forget that both teams met again in 2010, though with a different result. The Lakers took down the C's in the NBA Finals that year. Also remember that the Celtics have qualified for the playoffs every year since 2008 except one (2014). Not many teams can match that.

But what if had been nearly half a century since the Celtics had

That's the reality that fans of the New York Knicks wake up to every morning — no NBA championship since 1973. That is nearly five full decades without a trophy. And if you are thinking about iust making the NBA Finals, well, think again. The Knicks have yet to make the NBA Finals in the 21st century.

The last time the Knicks played in the NBA Finals was in the spring of 1999 when they lost to the San Antonio Spurs. In fact, the Knicks have made the playoffs only seven times since the current century began.

As for the Bruins, yes, they did have a long wait of 39 years before winning it all in 2011 when they beat Vancouver. They then made it to the Stanley Cup Final twice more, losing to Chicago in 2013 and to St. Louis in 2019. They have missed the playoffs only four times in the 21st century.

In addition, they won the Presidents' Trophy (most points in the regular season) twice and have finished with 100 or more points

By comparison, the New York Rangers, the Original Six team in New York, won their last Stanley Cup in 1994, and have made just one appearance in the Stanley Cup Final since — losing to the Los Angeles Kings in 2014.

Sure, the New York Islanders went to the Stanley Cup Final five times in the 1980s, winning four titles in a row, but they haven't been back to the championship round since. And although the New Jersey Devils had success way back (Cup winners in 1995, 2000, and 2003), they have only qualified once for the playoffs since 2012 and that was a first round exit in 2018.

So, when you hear some fans moan and groan over a Bruins or Celtics setback here and there, remember the winter sports teams in that certain metropolitan region to the south of Boston. And be glad you're here.
