
Arizona Dreamers Can Drive Now

Dark Moments for Revere as Tornado Roars Down Broadway

I found out the tornado struck down on Broadway near the ice skating rink and moved quickly through a large swath of Revere mostly down Broadway. Folks said it sounded like a freight train roaring down a track and everything in its path was struck in little more than four minutes time.

As one person told me. "The sky got dark, the rain come down, the winds kicked up and trees starting falling apart." Everyone was saying the same thing. As I walked up and down Broadway, it looked like ISIS running through Iraq. Destruction everywhere. Roofs of houses were blown off. Property damage wherever you looked. Cars covered in trees. Houses covered in trees. Live wires hanging down street after street.

I saw emergency folks working quickly following the tornado strike. Communities nearby came to the aid of Revere helping to restore some sanity in the community devastated by the brutality of this storm.

I have been told and was glad to hear that no one died and few were injured. Mayor Dan Rizzo called this a miracle and so do I.

All in all, it was reported that about 100 structures both business and residential were damaged with 13 getting condemned for being unsafe. These numbers might grow but most folks were just happy to be alive to talk about what happened.

A storm like this, the idea of a tornado hitting a seaside community made people understand how powerful nature can be and how helpless victims of such a nightmarish storm felt.



LT. JEREMIAH F. "JERRY" GOODWIN

Will Seek the Democratic Nomination in Special Election to Fill Suffolk County Sheriff Seat

His Principles are a Catalyst for Running

Candidate for Suffolk County Sheriff and Revere Police Lieutenant Jeremiah F. Goodwin does not want to be thought of as a politician, rather a senior law enforcement professional with over 30 years of law enforcement experience. He has the experience, dedication, and the determination to deliver effective police services and programs for the benefit of the county. Goodwin believes the



men and women of law enforcement should not be influenced by special interests or political needs, rather their duty to protect and serve the community.

Goodwin serves as Platoon Commander at the Revere Police Department.

He is a decorated public servant, earning accolades and commendations from the City of Revere, the Commonwealth, and the United States for specific acts of bravery and his commitment to serve.

If not for a trip to Camp Casey, South Korea in 2009 he would not be in this race. A fervent advocate for our nation's veterans, Goodwin was overseas to visit with our troops. While there, he befriended a great number of soldiers. He was proud to find a young generation of Americans who were "strong and willing to serve others."

One particular solider left a positive impression on Goodwin. The infantry solid, with some youthful indiscretions in his past, had become a skilled, combat tested, accomplished solider, and a consummate gentleman. It was plain to see the young veteran was ready to excel.

Upon the young soldiers honorable discharge from military service and return to the area, Goodwin was both surprised and disappointed when he learned the young veteran was denied employment by the Suffolk County Sheriff's Department. Relying upon his experience in community policing he will bring all stake holders to the table to establish effective, community-based outreach programs particularly focused on at risk youth and vulnerable members of society.

Goodwin is the only candidate in the race that has "walked the tiers" at the old Charles Street Prison under the Hon. Sheriff Robert C. Rufo. Goodwin will prioritize training, provide support, and efficiently allocate resources for the men and women who serve in the Sheriff's Department. A son of Revere, Goodwin attended St. Lazarus Parochial School and St. Dominic Savio Preparatory High School in East Boston where he played basketball. Burns, a long time Suffolk County Justice.

Goodwin's mother, Margaret Carol Buckley fought a decades long civil rights battle to become the first woman in the history of the Longshoreman's Union. Goodwin's inspiration to serve was nurtured by his Godfather Cornelius "Connie" Buckley, the well-known news editor at The Pilot Newspaper for over three decades. Goodwin grew up in family of eleven children, many of who are prominent members of Suffolk County communities.

What Goodwin treasures most in life is his role as a father. His eldest Jeremiah, Jr. followed in his footsteps serving his country in the United States Army Infantry and serving as a Police Officer in the Boston Police Department. His younger son Justin is a National Honor Society Member and high school student accepted to the S.T.E.M. Academy. His daughter Susan is a student with a perfect MCAS score and a growing interest in forensic science.




Fr. Claude Scrima Celebrates 80th Birthday

L'Anno Bello: A Year in Italian Folklore

Lammas: A Feast of Hay and Harvest

August is a golden sunbeam of a month, a time when the carefree nature of summer dances with the rhythms and rituals of autumn. Back-toschool advertisements pepper store aisles and newspapers, bringing with them the scent of crisp notebooks and sharp pencils. The night descends sooner, beckoning me home to cozy evenings spent curled up on the couch. Supermarkets brim with the abundant produce of summer — tomatoes, zucchini, corn — while also making way for the succulent

first apples of the season. However, the sign that most reminds me of August is the sight of hay, tightly bundled together in perfect spheres, baking in the sun. I saw these hay bundles recently at a farm near my house, and they instantly transported me back to the marvelous summer I spent in Italy years ago, when such rolls of hay were a common sight along roads and fields. Late summer in Italy is the time for la mietitura, or haying, all in preparation for the autumn. This reminds of the wonderful seasonal holiday of Lammas, a little-known feast that deserves wider fame for its poignant symbolism of harvest and the coming of the fall.

Lammas occurs on August 1st, and what was once a holiday celebrated in many parts of Europe fell into obscurity as society industrialized — though interest in it has been rekindled! According to the ancient Celts, Lammas celebrated the first day of autumn. This may sound quite strange to modern people, as the beginning of August seems to be in full summer, what with the hot temperatures and the leaves still a vibrant green. However, Lammas celebrates the agricultural start of the fall, the time of harvesting grain and the first fruits of the year. In fact, the very name Lammas derives from loaf-mass, after the ritual in which a loaf of bread, made from the first harvested wheat of the year, was blessed at church. The ancient Celts had another name for Lammas, Lughnasadh (loo-na-sah), which referred to a harvest feast in honor of Lugh, the god of light. To celebrate Lugh, the ancient Celts held bonfires, made pilgrimages to hilltops to be closer to the sun, gathered fruits and danced. Evidence of celebrations in honor of Lugh have been uncovered as far south as Northern Italy! Lammas is still observed in Ireland today, where people visit with family and friends, and local priests bless the fields. I love Lammas because it includes the communal aspect of summer festivities while also honoring the earth's bounty, which will only become more evident busy world.



as autumn progresses.

Every August 1st, when Lammas fills my with the music of a blessed and plentiful harvest, I too honor grain by making a focaccia. I turn to a beloved recipe that calls for a simple wheat focaccia made with rosemary, sea salt, onions, and the beloved Italian staple of olive oil. As I mix the water with the flour, forming a dough as if by magic, I feel a special kinship with my old-country ancestors who had to scrape their living out of the most basic ingredients.

For my Italian forbearers, a holiday like Lammas or an occasion like la mietitura was so important precisely because wheat functioned as an essential part of the diet. Bread, called pane in Italian, serves as an invaluable part of the cultural table, a foodstuff that gave peasants life and formed the basis of many dishes. It is little wonder that Italy contains many superstitions that demand that bread be treated with the utmost respect, such as never turning bread upside-down or, worse vet, the perils of throwing bread away. For Italians in olden days, this action proved a high insult to the Earth's bounty and to one of the most essential food tenets around. As society industrialized, I believe that we have lost that connection to our food and to the Earth which provides it. This is why seasonal feasts like Lammas are so significant — they unite us with our history and heritage, with the time when humans viewed the Earth and the food that sprung from her ground as sacred. Lammas teaches us that every season has a profound meaning.

This August, why not celebrate Lammas by honoring the grain that often goes unnoticed in your life? Make bread or focaccia from scratch, or simply be conscious of the nourishment that goes into you as you bite down into a roll or sandwich or slice of loaf. Revel in the growing harvest by eating seasonal foods and paying attention to the signs of the approaching autumn, in all their natural, rhythmic glory. Lammas teaches us not to bemoan the end of the summer, but rather recognize the change of the seasons as an indispensable part of the cycle of the year. Without autumn, there would be no harvest or food to sustain us once the dark nights creep in. I know that when I now look at stalks of wheat waving in a golden field, or bundles of hay standing steadfast under the sun, I will remember the way my ancestors lived so close to nature, and to honor that life even in our

The next day, management took away his street reporting assignments and demoted him. He basically was fired without management having to fire him. All for saying that the men of the African American community were missing in the lives of too many young African Americans.

This is the same message I heard from President Obama who once said too many Black men are AWOL. Bill Cosby once spoke at a high school graduation and talking directly to the parents in the audience said, "We must take back our community from the violence and we must be active in the lives of our children."

Can only African Americans speak truth to power but not white reporters who are outraged on what they are constantly reporting on? Did you know that 82 African American youths in Chicago were hit by gunfire over the recent Fourth of July weekend?

I have a feeling that Mr. Bergen will live to report

IT'S ALL ABOUT FAMILY!

Saint Olaf Haraldsson of Norway

Martyr and King of Norway, Olaf Haraldsson was the son of King Harald Grenske. In his youth, he lived the life of a Norse raider (Viking) until he was baptized at Rouen in the year 1010. In the year 1013, he journeyed to England and offered his services to King Ethelred against the invading Danes. Returning home in 1015 after succeeding to the throne, he embarked upon a war to free Norway from the domination of the Danes and the Swedes, defeating Earl Sweyn at Nesje in 1016. He also immediately requested that missionaries be sent from England to advance the Christianization of Norway. Owing to the strict nature of his rule, he faced a rebellion of nobles in 1029. Through the aid

of the formidable King Canute of Denmark, the rebels overthrew him and drove him into exile in Russia. Olaf returned in 1031 but was slain in battle at Stiklestad, Norway on July 29, 1031.

He ruled Norway for thirteen years. (1015-1028). Most memorable among his accomplishments as King was the development of what came to be known as St. Olaf's Law. Ahead of its time, Olaf's Law prescribed prayer to Christ for peace, required newborn babies to be allowed to live and not abandoned in fields or forests, slaves were to be ransomed each year, polygamy was forbidden, and severe penalties were exacted for rape and kidnapping. Olaf himself traveled the length of Norway promoting his new Christian Law, and he insisted that it be applied equally upon both rich and poor.

This new concept, equality before the Law, and the Christian ideas which surrounded it, were too much for some of the clan leaders, they betraved Olaf and supported Canute of Denmark in his successful attempt to unseat him. In his two years of exile in Russia, he prayed and fasted. Then one night in a dream, he heard God calling him to return to Norway, to reconquer it for Christ. And so with a small band of warriors, Olaf re-entered his homeland, but outnumbered two to one, met his death on July 29, 1031. Immediately, he was revered as a martyr and his tomb became a holy shrine. Within a year, the faith which he had labored so hard during his lifetime to instill, with little effect, began to flourish and grow after his death. Norway became Christian.

He was posthumously given the title Rex Perpetuus Norvegiae (Norway's Eternal King). The belief in his sanctity spread widely in Norway especially in Nidaros (Trondheim) by Bishop Grimkell, one year after his death his remains were enshrined.

Olaf was made a saint of the Church in 1164 by Pope Alexander III, his feast is celebrated on July 29th. He is the patron saint of Norway.



Currently at the MFA ... One of only four surviving copies of the original Magna Carta — a document written in 1215 that subsequently served as a symbol for liberty around the world — travels to the Museum of Fine Arts, Boston this summer for a special exhibition of approximately 20 works in the Museum's Art of the Americas Wing.

An inspiration for the U.S. Constitution and Bill of Rights, the exemplar owned by the UK's Lincoln Cathedral and typically housed in Lincoln Castle will be on view in the exhibition, Magna Carta: Cornerstone of Liberty, through September 1st, 2014.

In partnership with the Massachusetts Historical Society (MHS) and the Massachusetts House of Representatives, Magna Carta will join historical loans as well as portraits and works of art from the Museum's collection. The MFA's Sons of Liberty Bowl (1768) by Paul Revere — which is engraved with the words "Magna/ Charta" and "Bill of/Rights" — will be among the works that help tell the story of patriots and revolutionaries who fought for freedom in the face of tyranny across the centuries.

Speaker of the House Robert A. DeLeo (D-Winthrop), State Representative Cory Atkins (D-Concord), House Chair of the Joint Committee on Tourism, Arts, and Cultural Development, and Alice Richmond, Deputy Chair of the Magna Carta 800th Anniversary 2015 Committee, worked with the MFA and Lincoln Cathe-

dral to secure the loan of Magna Carta.

This historical document will be on display through September 1st at the Museum of Fine Arts located at 465 Huntington Avenue, Boston which can be reached at 617-267-9300 or you can visit www.mfa.org for more information.

As it was, and as it is ... As you enter the Pittsfield Post Office on Fenn Street turn to the right instead of to the left and step back in time to an era when the City of Pittsfield was a young, bright place and the buildings sparkled with the intensity allowed fine architectural works of art. A series of photographs by Edwin Hale Lincoln (1848-1938) portray Pittsfield as it was in the early part of the 20th Century.

These glass-plate negative platinum prints were seen at Arrowhead in a special exhibit last year, curated by Al DeMaio, and are now on semi-permanent display in the lobby at the Post Office along with contemporary photos of those same locations today.

Born in Westminster, Massachusetts, Edwin Hale Lincoln went into the photographic business in Brockton in 1876. In 1862, at age 14, he became a drummer boy and surgeon's helper, serving nine months mostly in North Carolina, with the $Mass a chusetts \ 5^{th} \ Voluntary$ In-fantry during the Civil War. He pioneered photographing yachts under full sail in Newport, Rhode Island and became one of the first photographers to specialize in documenting large estates.

On commission, he photographed the mansions of Newport and Lenox, Massachusetts in their turn-ofthe-century splendor. In the 1890s, Edwin Hale Lincoln settled in the Berkshires and began an extensive photographic study of New England wild flowers. He published his photographs taken over a 30 year period in a handmade, small-edition folio of platinum prints called Wild Flowers of New England.

Edwin Hale Lincoln's wildflower studies were widely used in university botany departments and in schools of fine art. He also made studies of trees, orchids, and landscapes.

While many photographers of the day were working in the soft focus and painterly mode of Pictorialism, Edwin Hale Lincoln's photographs were influenced by the Arts and Crafts movement. His "straight" and direct style



Researchers at the University of Glasgow in the U.K. tracked the health habits, tea consumption and medical reports of more than 6,000 men between the ages of 21 and 75 over nearly 40 years. They found that those who drank more than seven cups of black tea per day were 50 percent more likely to develop prostate cancer than those who had three cups or fewer. The finding is surprising because previous research has suggested that drinking tea lowers the risk of cancer, heart disease and diabetes. In fact, drinking black tea may have an overall positive health effect that trumps its correlation with prostate cancer. Enough said. Time for a spot-of-tea!

Heady news! It's not just football players who risk lasting brain damage from taking multiple blows to the head. Young female athletes playing sports like soccer and lacrosse may be even more susceptible. Researchers at Michigan State University tested more than 200 high school and college athletes after they endured concussions. They found that female athletes had more symptoms than men did — including headaches, nausea, and dizziness - and also performed worse than concussed men on memory tests. The findings complement previous research showing that girls suffer twice as many concussions as boys who play the same sport. Researchers aren't sure why. Among girls, soccer players suffer the most concussions, cheerleaders and volleyball players are also at high risk.

CALAMARI (SQUID) IN TOMATO SAUCE

Over Linguine

- 14 ounces crushed tomatoes 1 medium chopped onion
- 1 large chopped garlic clove
- (optional) 1/4 cup olive, canola or
- vegetable oil
- 1 teaspoon dried basil or two fresh basil leaves
- 2 pounds already cleaned calamari (squid)
- 3 tablespoons white or red wine of choice
- 1 pound of linguine

Grated Romano or Parmesan cheese

Heat oil in skillet, add chopped onion, garlic (optional), and basil. Simmer until onion is opaque. Garlic should not brown. Add crushed tomatoes and stir thoroughly. Cover and simmer sauce until it comes to a slow boil. Lower heat and simmer for about twenty minutes. Stir occasionally to prevent sauce from sticking to the bottom of skillet. If mixture appears to be too thick, add a half-cup of water and

Cut tentacles from calamari if not already separated. Wash and cut each calamari into approximately one-inch widths. Do not cut lengthwise. A small calamari should give about three portions. Wash both thoroughly. Set aside in a bowl.

When sauce has simmered about twenty minutes, add calamari and tentacles. Then stir and cover. Simmer calamari in sauce for about five minutes. Do not overcook. calamari will become tough if cooked too long. Cover and remove skillet from heat until you are ready to cook pasta.

Cook linguine, or pasta of your choice, according to the directions on the package.

While pasta is cooking, return calamari sauce mixture to burner to reheat slowly. Add three tablespoons of red or white wine of choice. Bring to a slow boil. Turn off burner and remove from heat. Place cooked and strained pasta onto a serving platter and top with tomato sauce, calamari, and grated cheese of choice.

OPTIONAL: Adding additional calamari to the sauce will allow some to be served with the pasta and some separately with a fresh green salad. Remaining sauce freezes well. Serves two.



Summer Reading Recommendations (Part III)

MIKE SILVER:


Boxing historian Mike Silver is the author of the The Arc of Boxing: The Rise and Decline of the Sweet Science (McFarland Publishers, 2008). I just finished a wonderful boxing book that I rank among the best I have ever read. It is titled, The Gods of War: Boxing Essays by Spring Toledo (Tora Book Publishing Co., 2014). It is so pleasing to discover an author with such a rare understanding of the complexities — both physical and

psychological — of this sport and its athletes. Many times while reading this book I had to stop and admire the brilliantly crafted prose of this gifted writer. The book is comprised of 21 essays. Among his subjects are Roberto Duran, Wladimir Klitschko, Alexis Arguello, Sonny Liston and Sugar Ray Leonard. But the icing on the cake are his ten essays in which he rates the 10 greatest boxers since 1920 — or as he calls them, "the gods of war." Toledo's arguments are insightful and logical. I won't give away who is number 1 except to say it is neither Muhammad Ali nor Sugar Ray Robinson. This is definitely not your rank and file boxing book. File this one under "Superlative."

Among the top three boxing books I have ever read is Beyond Glory: Joe Louis vs. Max Schmeling and a World on the Brink by David Margolick (New York: Alfred A. Knopf, 2005). The two heavyweight fights in New York in 1936 and 1938 between Joe Louis and Max Schmeling galvanized the world at a piv-



otal moment in twentieth century history. At a time when boxing rivaled baseball in popularity the heavyweight championship was unequivocally the most important title in sports. In 1936 Max Schmeling had scored a major upset when he knocked out the seemingly invincible Joe Louis. The return bout in 1938 for the heavyweight championship of the world was fought under extraordinary circumstances. Louis represented the free world and Schmeling was seen as a representative of the evil Nazi regime. The historic bout symbolized the hopes, hatreds and fears of a world on the brink of World War II. Margolick's magnificent prose and meticulous research vividly captures the outpouring of emotion the two fighters aroused and the broader societal implications. You do not have to be a boxing fan to appreciate and enjoy Beyond Gloru.


One of the first boxing books I read as a boy was "Somebody Up There Likes Me" the story of Graziano by Rocky Rowland Barber. I identified with Graziano. Like Rocky and many other fighters I started out with two strikes against me, but found my way to the New Garden Gym. I still

abide by many of the lessons I learned inside the "squared circle." The title of the book comes from Rocky. He describes a fight that he was losing badly, thoughts of getting knocked out crossing his mind, when he heard a single voice from somewhere in the crowd cheering for him, calling his name, and that voice inspired him. He went on to win the fight. I adapted the title "Somebody Up There Likes Me," to my life. No matter how dark it got, I always got down on my knees at night. Things got better and I believe it happened that way and tell others in the same circumstances, because "Somebody Up There Likes Me." It's a thought that always gave me hope.




